Dear Friends,

The disciples ask Jesus, their mentor and real example, to teach them how to pray. Jesus encourages true humility, honesty, and perseverance. Saints and theologians would call this attitude in prayer “confident spiritual poverty”. An honest realization that we are nothing without God and an admittance of our dependence on God for all that we are, have and hope to accomplish, will yield great results. As Jesus teaches the disciples to pray, he reminds them and us of the key to prayer.

***“And I tell you, ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you.”***

Jesus tells us in today’s Gospel of the importance of articulating our needs and of letting others, and, of course, God, know what we need from them. He assures us of the generosity of God. God will give us what we need. Period.

Let me tell you about my friend Jaime. I have known Jaime for more than half his life. Years ago, when he was seventeen, he was shot, an innocent victim of drive-by gang violence. The bullet remained in his spine and he is paralyzed from the waist down. He worked hard over several years to accomplish the goal of being accepted to the University of Illinois and playing for the wheelchair basketball team at the school, a team that is internationally known.

When he was in his early twenties, he received the news that he finally had gained acceptance to the school. He told me the good news right away, along with the news that in order to really compete, he needed to purchase a special wheelchair. He needed a basketball chair, so he asked. He articulated his need. Wheelchairs, especially the specialized ones, cost a lot of money. So I said, “Let’s have a party!”

And so we did. My friends and I invited many people who knew this young man’s story, along with some who didn’t. People came; people sent checks, cash, gift cards and words of encouragement. By the end of the night, we had more money than we needed to purchase the best basketball chair we could find. The young man experienced the generosity of others – because he asked. And he used the gift and made the best of people’s generosity. After playing many seasons for the school’s adaptive basketball team and on many other teams, he was selected to coach the Wounded Warriors Marine Team – a wheelchair basketball team comprised of disabled veterans. Now in his mid thirties, he is a mentor and model of hope for those who have suffered debilitating injuries in their service of our country. He asked and received and made the best of the gift. And our world is better for it.

People are generous. God is good, all the time!  
So, ***ask, seek and knock!***

Some of us have difficulty asking others and maybe even God for help. Jesus tells us in no uncertain terms that God wants us to ask, seek, and knock. God will

answer our pleas and give us what we need. He will give us the Holy Spirit, Jesus tells us. What a great gift! With the guidance of the Holy Spirit we can accomplish anything. We just need the humility to rid ourselves of radical independence and to come before our provident God and admit our neediness.

Maybe we are not paralyzed; perhaps we don’t have serious financial problems. We *all* have some need. What do you need from the Lord? What does our unified community need from God? Do we dare to ask? Are we afraid to seek, too proud to knock? When we follow Jesus’ instructions we’ll be given great gifts. Let’s go together to encounter the Lord.

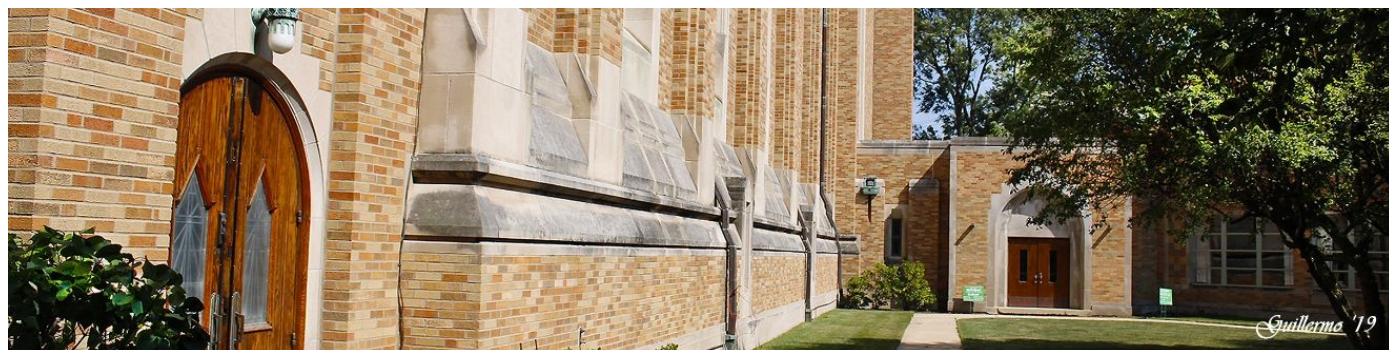

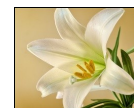

## Speaking of Liturgy

July 28: 17<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today we heard the presentation of the "Our Father" prayer as given to us in the Gospel of Luke. It happened when the disciples saw Jesus in prayer and then they asked Him to teach them to how to pray to God. Isn't it wonderful that Jesus invited them, (us!) to call God "Our Father!" That certainly invites us to believe that Jesus is our Brother!

Throughout the gospels Jesus prays publicly and privately, in front of crowds and in the intimate group of His closest disciples. He prays from the beginning of His public ministry marked with His baptism by John in the Jordan, to His last breath on the cross when He commends His spirit to His Father. And it is with a prayer that He ascends into heaven after His resurrection (Luke 24:50-53).

In prayer we enter into the paschal mystery. May it lead us to new life, too!

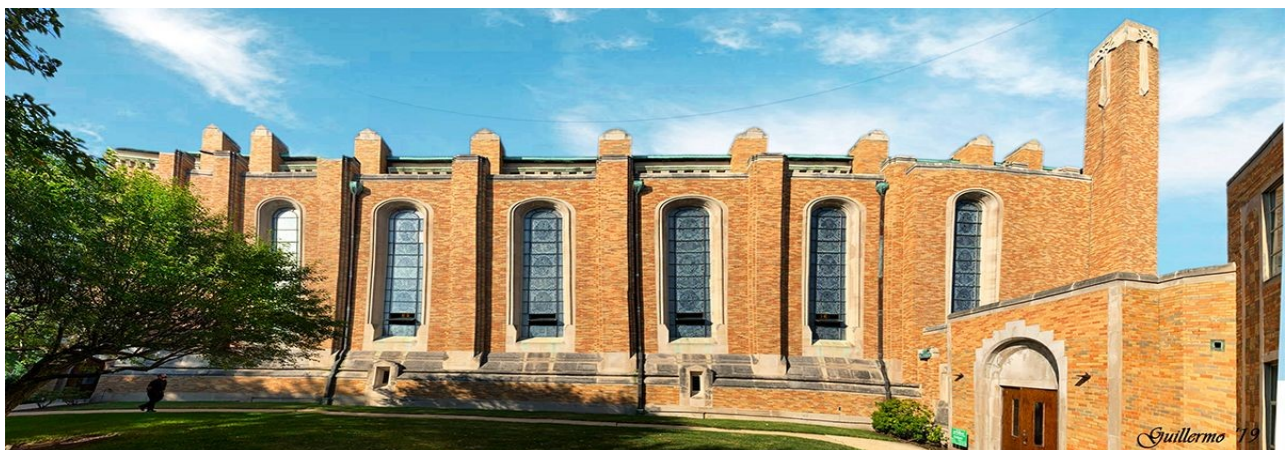

**Your spiritual needs are very important to the staff at Ss. Joseph and Francis Xavier.** To insure that you received the desired spiritual care if you are hospitalized or homebound with illness, please assist us by providing us with the following.

### Hospital:

If you would like anointing prior to a scheduled surgery, please call the parish office to schedule an anointing with a priest. You may also receive anointing at the hospital when there is an emergency.

When you are admitted to the hospital it is critical that you or a loved one identifies your religious affiliation, your parish name and your desire for pastoral care and communion visits.

The patient may also call the Ministry of Care line to request communion at the hospital. A Minister of Care will make sure the hospital is informed of this request.

### Homebound:

Trained Ministers of Care are available to bring communion to our parish sick and homebound.

Ministers also visit local assisted living and nursing care homes. To schedule a visit, please call the Ministry of Care line at: 847 256-2273 press 0 and a Minister of Care will return your call.
