Dear Friends,

As we listen to this weekend's Sacred Scripture readings, we hear words of challenge and of mission. God calls us each to an important task. We, out of duty, must discern our call. We must put our faith into action. We must go out into the world, as the psalmist says, and tell the Good News. So often people think that the role of telling the Good News is left only to the priests and the religious. Wrong. The task of proclaiming belongs to all of the baptized. We must let the world know - by the way we live our lives - that Christ's victory is **our** victory and that the Lord is present in **our** midst. We can do this in many ways.

We can live with joy. Nothing is more attractive than a joyful person. When people see joy in our lives and on our faces, they're drawn to us. When we let them know that the cause of our joy is the love, gentleness and mercy of God, we announce the Good News. Are you joyful? If not, why not? Look around you. See God's goodness. Feel God's presence. Know God's love. And be joyful. At Saints Joseph and Francis Xavier we have many reasons to be joyful. Great things are happening here in 60091 and beyond.

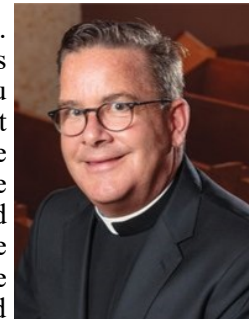
We can stand for justice. I'm not sure about you, but polarization in our political world alarms me. I cannot remember a time in my life when I experienced so much division and explosive language that leads to physical violence and tragedy. Many commentators opine about justice and injustice. Depending on what news station you watch (I don't watch any since I don't even have a television) you hear strong biases about whatever the latest issue is at hand.

To go out to all the world and tell the Good News, first and foremost, we, as Catholic Christians in today's world, need to know right from wrong. In this day when any action can be rationalized, the lines that separate right from wrong blur. People think moral absolutes are a thing of the past. Discipline is an unpopular term. Justice requires knowledge of right from wrong, and the discipline to choose the right, no matter the cost or inconvenience. Standing for justice, and living with discipline, we make known the Good News.

We can practice mercy. The Good News proclaimed news about a loving, merciful God. We all need God's Mercy. When Jesus taught his disciples to pray the prayer we continue to pray often, he told them to say, "Forgive us... as we forgive." To tell the Good News is to forgive as we seek to be forgiven. We have people in our lives who have wronged us, who have hurt us, and against whom we hold a grudge. I heard a speaker once say, "Holding a grudge is like drinking gasoline and hoping the other person will die." It's unhealthy, and unchristian. Let's forgive those against whom we have a grudge, practice mercy, and tell the Good News!

We can welcome others. Jesus invited people to follow. His friends said to others, "Come and see!" Telling the Good News involves more than just telling. It

requires inviting and welcoming. RCIA at Saints Joseph and Francis Xavier begins soon. Have you considered inviting someone without a church home to consider joining the Roman Catholic Church and the community of Saints Joseph and Francis Xavier? In RCIA, people with no church affiliation and those from other faith traditions "come and see" what the Catholic Church is about. At Easter, if they so desire, they are welcomed into full communion through one or more of the Sacraments of Initiation, Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. Invite someone! I think of the song, "All Are Welcome." The first line says, "Let us build a house where love can dwell, and all can safely live, a place where saints and children tell how hearts learn to forgive." That's my dream for Saints Joseph and Francis Xavier. You are or can be a part of it. It's your baptismal call. When we live that spirit, we are going out to all the world and telling the Good News.

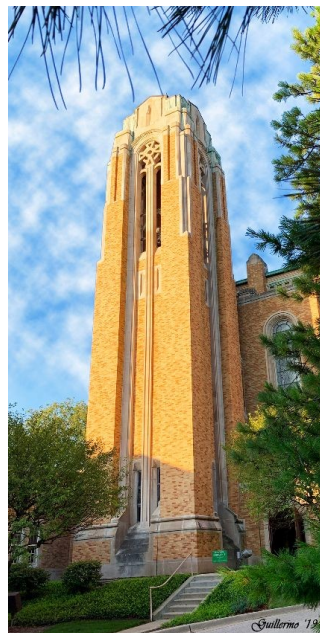

Sam Dagher

Author of *Assad or We Burn the Country: How One Family's Lust for Power Destroyed Syria*

Confronting Mass Atrocity:

The Syrian Crisis that Changed the World

Moderator: Dr. Zaher Sahloul is a Critical Care specialist and a MedGlobal President and Co-Founder. He has led many multiple medical missions to Syria and to the neighboring countries. He is an advocate for humanitarian aid in the Syrian crisis, refugee rights and immigration reform. He was a medical school classmate with Bashar al-Assad. Dr. Sahloul was one of three awardees named Chicago's magazine's Chicagoans of the Year in 2016.

Sam Dagher has reported in the Middle East for more than fifteen years, most recently for The Atlantic. He was the only non-Syrian reporter for a major Western media outlet based in Damascus from 2012 to 2014, a period during which he was arrested by a pro-Assad militia and briefly held in an underground mukhabarat (secret police) prison. He has worked for the Wall Street Journal, the New York Times, the Christian Science Monitor, and Agence France Presse, and has covered the conflict in Iraq, the Arab Spring uprisings, and Libya. The Wall Street Journal nominated Dagher's work from Syria for the Pulitzer Prize and other journalism awards.
