Dear Friends,

As I am installed as the pastor of Saints Joseph and Francis Xavier, joy, gratitude and hope fill my heart. I've been back in Wilmette for almost ten months. I've witnessed great faith, passion and discipleship in so many of you. You want the best for our new parish. Getting to this point of unification has certainly had its trials, but through it all, your love for Jesus and for His Church has ruled the day.

Nearly four months ago, we gathered as one community in Vattman Park for our Unity Mass. Everyone worked together to make the day special. We asked God's blessing for that which we were about to do. As always, God has guided our local community with the power of the Holy Spirit.

**Together, we have come a long way.**

We have jumped the hurdles of the naming process and Mass schedule changes. We came together as a unified parish pastoral council and finance committee. Our Cross Functional Transition Team thoughtfully guided the process.

The pastoral and support staffs committed to being disciples, making disciples and articulating ways we can be radically hospitable as we welcome potential disciples. We blended the school board to include members of two communities with proud histories and strong traditions. We established a long-range planning committee charged with determining the best use of our two beautiful school campuses. We began the investigation of the capital needs of our many buildings. We penned a unity prayer that has been used throughout the archdiocese.

We gathered in so many ways for prayer and for community building. As a result, we have one of the largest combined Catholic schools in Cook and Lake Counties. And from all accounts, our kids are happy. Our two robust religious education programs welcome hundreds of kids each week. We are learning of the historical charitable outreach programs and are responding generously to the needs of our local and world families.

I could go on and on with the successes God has allowed (and has used so many of your great gifts) over these past several months. I am filled with gratitude.

Joy comes to me first and foremost because I know I am a child of God and I have Jesus as my companion, mentor and example as I humbly make my profession of faith and promise to serve you and pray for you as your pastor.

Having Jesus as a friend along this journey helps tremendously, especially when things get tough and some are disappointed with tough decisions I sometimes make. He made tough decisions too. He invites me and us to take up our crosses and follow. His example and victory give me great joy, as do the words of encouragement so many of you have shared. Pride and joy come, too, as I see the great things that happen - in Wilmette and beyond - because of your faithfulness, dedication and love.

**Together, we will do even more great things.**

I know, on this installation day, that we have miles to go. That's where hope comes in. Looking ahead, we need to:

Develop a fiscally responsible plan to use our facilities in a way that best benefits the children entrusted to our care.

Ramp up our evangelization efforts to engage those who have drifted and those who don't know Jesus and invite them to discipleship.

Engage ourselves, committing to serving God and the Church, and not view our Church as a service station.

Do our part to continue to promote vocations to the priesthood, religious life and full-time ministry in our Church.

Invite families in our schools and religious education programs to fully participate in the life of the Church.

Encourage parishioners (we have 2,400 registered) to consider their commitment to worship and their financial support of our ministries.

Witness. Invite. Welcome. Engage. I hope those four words will guide what we do. And I hope we find a way to be radically hospitable in our efforts. When I say, "we," I hope each of you will participate in the efforts. Without his people, the pastor is nothing. I love you and I need you.

I finish by thanking all who have befriended Jesus, who have committed to discipleship, who have given of their time talent and treasure, who have worked hard to make this day beautiful and meaningful. Gratitude. Joy. Hope. That's where I am today. Please pray for me as I do for you.

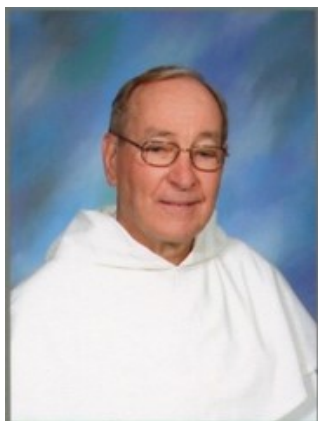
