

From the Loft

The Communion aria heard at the 9:30 and 11:30am SFX Mass is *Gelobet sei der Herr, mein Gott* from the church cantata (BWV 129) of the same title by Johann Sebastian Bach. Composed in 1727, the text of the cantata is a general praise of the Trinity. Pastoral and with dance-like joyfulness, the aria is scored in three parts: an obligato line (played on violin), a vocal line, and a continuo line (played on organ). While each part weaves independently of the next, Bach manages something quite remarkable. For just a brief moment, all three parts converge together in unison as the vocalist sings, "God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit." This is a musical representation of the Trinity, three in one. Below is a translation of the text:

Praised be the Lord,my God, who lives forever, whom all things praise,that soars in the air; praised be the Lord,whose name is called Holy, God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit.
