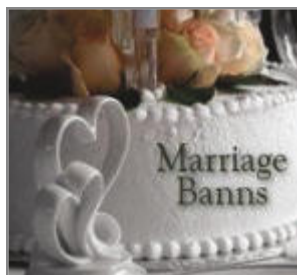

Dear Friends,

My friend, Saint Peter -- the one who always has something to say and only about half the time says the right thing, gets it right in today's Gospel. Following Jesus' Bread of Life Discourse, many of those who thought about following Him find Him to be too much, too bold in His proclamation of His intimate relationship with the Father. They leave Him one by one. When Jesus asks his twelve closest if they, too, want to leave, Simon Peter says boldly, "*Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God.*"

Sometimes the words and teachings and example of Jesus challenge us. The Christian life, and all that it entails seem, even today, to be too much. Our society preaches a different gospel rather than the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The gospel of entitlement, the gospel of radical individualism, and the gospel of the overvalued ego sometimes prevail. We hold firm to our agendas and often disrespect those who do not share our belief about how things should be. We turn away from Jesus and go back to our own way of life.

When we finally let go of the ego and allow the love of Jesus to fill our hearts, Jesus can work wonders in us and through us. When we release the grip on our individual agendas and work together for the common good, amazing things happen. When we live generously, humbly, and with a heart focused on the other, our provident God gives us what we need and allows us to build the kingdom of God here on earth. It requires, though, losing the "I'm right and they are wrong" attitude. It demands openness, humility, gentleness, patience, and love. It necessitates courage, to confront societal pressures and do the good -- the true good for the common good.

Simon Peter gets it right! He proclaims that there is no other place to go but to Jesus. So, in this crazy time, when in doubt, let's go to Jesus who has the words of eternal life and who is indeed the way, the truth, and the life.

From the Pastor's Desk...

Many have been wondering about the fate of the Car Mass. Certainly, we never planned the Car Mass to last as long as it has. It has been a true blessing to our community. Many of you have let me know just how helpful it has been to you during these pandemic days. We originally had planned to return to Saint Joseph Church for the 10:30 am Mass after Labor Day as we try to get closer and closer to pre-pandemic normal. The parish choir, comprised of members of the two former parish choirs, eagerly awaits the chance to enhance the worship at our indoor Masses. The Delta Variant of the virus has caused us to rethink the


timing of the return to an indoor 10:30 am Mass. For nearly a year and a half we have learned to pivot and to be creative to encourage worship and allow for the faithful to receive Our Lord in the Eucharist. So, pivot again we do. We will continue the Car Mass through the month of September.

As we do come inside for Mass, we have been encouraged to remind you that facial coverings are strongly recommended. The priests, deacons and liturgical ministers will all be wearing masks until further notice. Please consider doing the same when you come to Mass. As I look out from my vantage point, it is good to see that many of you are already wearing masks. Thanks for that. Pleased DO come to Mass if you are feeling well. And if you are not well, please stay home, keep yourself and others safe, and join us for Mass on our YouTube channel!

At Saints JFX we want to respect every Catholic who is prepared to receive Holy Communion, whether they desire to receive our Lord reverently on the tongue or reverently in their hands. At this time, to help everyone feel more comfortable, we ask that if you would like to receive Holy Communion on the tongue, please present yourself only to a priest or deacon.

On Monday, Father Ryan and I concelebrated the "Back to School Mass" for the faculty and staff of our great schools. We welcomed nearly 100 dedicated teammates and asked for God's help and guidance as we enter another unusual educational year. I thanked those who sacrifice much to partner with our parents in the education and Catholic formation of the children God entrusts to our care. This week, almost 700 students will descend upon our two campuses to begin the academic year. As your pastor, I thank all the parishioners for their fiscal and moral support of our great schools, and I invite and encourage school families to dive even deeper into the life of this great parish. Come to Mass. Get involved. Share your time, talent, and treasure.

SSJFX Parish Choir Masses and rehearsals

Due to the changing nature of Covid and the restrictions, our choir schedule will change from month to month.
