

HAVE YOU EXPERIENCED IT?

What does an adorer do? Well—just that, adore! Worship Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament as He comes out of the Tabernacle to be exposed on the altar to us. As an adorer, we pray, sit, rest, and receive His love. Mostly though, we invite Jesus into our hearts to console, encourage and strengthen us.

When and Where? Currently there is Eucharistic Adoration for one hour after Tuesday daily morning mass at Saint Joseph's campus. Starting in November, we will be offering all-day adoration on the first Tuesday of every month (SJ campus). Mark your calendars for our first all-day adoration on November 2 from 9:00 am until 7:00 pm.

The last hour of adoration (6:00 pm until 7:00 pm) will be devoted to families to bring their children and worship. During this family holy hour, the Sacrament of Reconciliation will be offered. 
