Dear Friends,

Love wins!

Once again, the Church provides us with timely food for thought in this week's lectionary selections. As we experience strong polarization in politics and in Church, the need for Jesus' words regarding the greatest commandments appears. I have been following (at least from a distance) politics and civil discourse since I was able to vote, for nearly 40 years. Never has the spirit of incivility struck me more than this year. Many people have strong feelings, for whatever reason, about many different issues. You name the issue, and within a room you can find opposite views, even violent opposition in the same room.

The negativity and ad hominem arguing has reared its head in the most unlikely places. The divisive tone of conversation has dominated lunchrooms and chat rooms, dinner tables and doorsteps, even prayer groups and Church meetings! I have the bad habit of reading comments on social media. Talk about a place where love is lost! I'm shocked to see what the bishops are saying about one another – and even about the Successor of Peter, the Vicar for Christ, Pope Francis himself! I have heard of some people quitting their longtime memberships in religious organizations over the hostile political tone that has invaded them.

What does our Lord have to say to us this week, as we prepare for the end of another liturgical year, and, as we do so, the end of time?

Hear, O Israel!

The Lord our God is Lord alone!

***You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart,
with all your soul,
with all your mind,
and with all your strength.***

The second is this:

You shall love your neighbor as yourself.

There is no other commandment greater than these.

Perhaps we can allow our following of the greatest commandment to motivate our thoughts and direct our relationships with other people, especially those with whom we disagree, this week. Our moral obligation requires us to be informed about the issues, and to act in promotion of the *common good*. Our own needs and our own pocketbook must not be that which motivates our actions and guides our words.

“And no one had the courage to ask him anymore questions.” Do you ever wonder why no one had the courage to ask any more questions? The scribe was clear and bold in his questioning of Jesus and was enthusiastic as he heard Jesus' response. Jesus affirmed the scribe as he agreed with him and told him, as he answered with understanding, “You are not far from the reign of God.”

Perhaps the fact that Jesus answered a question asking for **THE** greatest commandment with **TWO** commandments threw the listeners off. Maybe it shook them up. I hope it shakes us up a bit. The two commandments, given as they were by Jesus, cannot be separated. When we say we love God and treat others with unkindness or disrespect, we completely disregard Jesus' twofold command. And that's happening too much in our civic and Church arenas.



Today more than ever, with the polarization that exists in our society and in our Church, we need to love our neighbor, even the neighbor with whom we disagree, even the neighbor who speaks a different language, even the neighbor who is a different color, or sexual orientation, or socioeconomic background. The love of neighbor as oneself cannot be a conditional love. We cannot say, “I will love you as long as you look like me, act like me, vote like me, and agree with me.”

Many young people turn away from the Church because of what they see as hypocrisy. They ask me how a church founded on the law of love can be filled with so many people who judge others harshly and exclude them for one reason or another. Jesus, in his earthly ministry, showed profound love for everyone, especially the marginalized. When members of his church criticize, disrespect, and disregard the marginalized, we separate the two laws that Jesus joined.

Love wins. It never fails. It endures. It bears all things, hopes all things, believes all things. Love is the greatest. Let's live love!

EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION

HAVE YOU EXPERIENCED IT?

You have probably heard about it or maybe even seen it a handful of times. Consider this a personal invitation to experience Jesus in the Eucharist as an adorer.



What is Eucharistic Adoration? Simply put, it is Jesus Christ present in the Holy Eucharist exposed in a monstrance (the vessel that displays the consecrated host). The monstrance is displayed on the altar.

What does an adorer do? Well—just that, adore! Worship Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament as He comes out of the Tabernacle to be exposed on the altar to us. As an adorer, we pray, sit, rest, and receive His love. Mostly though, we invite Jesus into our hearts to console, encourage and strengthen us.

When and Where? Currently there is Eucharistic Adoration for one hour after Tuesday daily morning mass at Saint Joseph's campus. Starting in November, we will be offering all-day adoration on the **first Tuesday of every month (SJ campus)**. Mark your calendars for our first all-day adoration on **November 2 from 9:00 am until 7:00 pm**.

The last hour of adoration (6:00 pm until 7:00 pm) will be devoted to families to bring their children and worship. During this family holy hour, the Sacrament of Reconciliation will be offered. So come and see what it is all about — come for one hour or just 10 minutes. Bring a friend or neighbor. Come by yourself or bring your entire family no matter how small (or loud)! Just come.

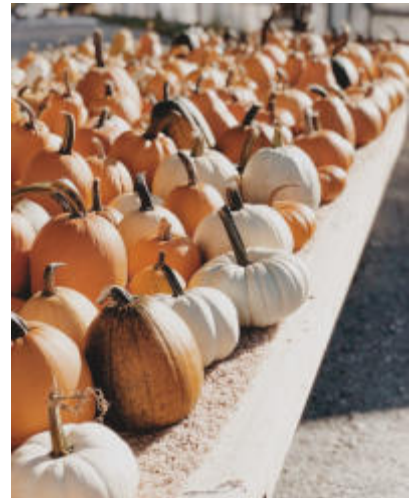

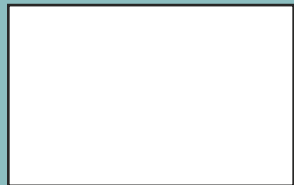
