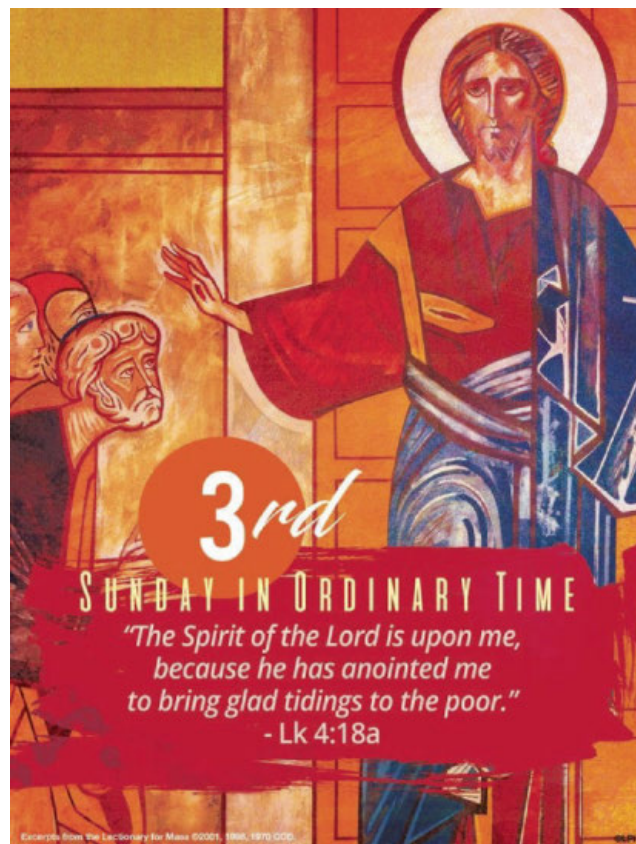

Dear Friends,

Today we hear the beginning of Saint Luke's Gospel. He begins the Gospel by setting out the purpose of his writing. He addresses this Gospel, and the Acts of the Apostles, to Theophilus (the lover of God). As members of his body, we too are called to be lovers of God.

Then Luke gets right into the purpose of Jesus' earthly ministry. Luke portrays Jesus, before the elders, teachers, and leaders of the people, reading a very familiar passage from the book of the prophet Isaiah. The people knew the passage, and hung on its every word, because they needed a savior. They longed for glad tidings, healing, sight, and release. They awaited the year of favor. And Jesus told them that he was the one who would and could do it. He is the fulfillment of the scriptures. Jesus gives us the freedom our spirit needs and invites us to be part of his body.

Last week I met up with some Catholic Charities volunteers at a downtown restaurant. I arrived a little late because I had celebrated Mass at the Shirley Ryan Ability Lab. As I entered, I greeted my friends, who were joined by someone who I didn't know as a regular volunteer. She jumped out of her seat and said, "I recognized your voice. I went to Denver with you in 1993. That trip made a big difference in my life." That was nearly thirty years ago, and it made a big difference in my life too. As I thought about sharing, via text message, the reunion photo with some of the other travelers on that trip (that took place nearly thirty years ago), I realized that I had the cellphone numbers of every one of the trip's participants. Many parts to the one body, all connected through faith.

In 1993, I traveled with about a dozen young people, mostly from Wilmette, to world Youth Day in Denver Colorado. In Mile High Stadium, as the helicopter carrying the great John Paul II came into view of the nearly hundred thousand faithful young people, we waved, swayed, and sang a song written for the occasion. The song is called *We Are One Body*. Throughout the last week, the refrain and the verses of that spirited song have been running through my head. Today we hear Saint Paul reminding the people of Corinth that we indeed are one body. He tells them and us that when one member of the body suffers, we all suffer.

The simple refrain of the song sung in Denver states: "*We are one body, one body in Christ, and we do not stand alone. We are one body, one body in Christ. And He came that we might have life.*" One verse asks, "*Can you hear them crying, can you feel their pain? Will you feed my hungry, will you help my lame?*" Amidst everything that is happening in our world, we need to hear the strong simple statement, and we need to hear and answer the questions posed by the song.

That rings true in the light of this week's Gospel. We are free to love. We are free to listen to God's will. We are free to respond. We are free because Jesus has made us free, free to become his disciples, to bring glad tidings to the poor, to proclaim liberty to captives, to proclaim God's Good News.

As members of his body, and as members of a local and world community, we too can fulfill the scriptures. We can continue the mission of Jesus Christ. In fact, by virtue of our baptism and incorporation into the Body of Christ we *must* continue his mission, in Wilmette and beyond! What are you doing to fulfill the scriptures? What are you doing to build up the body of Christ?

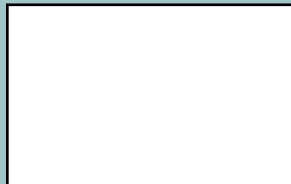

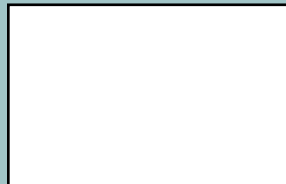
