Dear Friends,

The Scriptures for this weekend paint specific pictures of calls. The Lord appeared to the prophet, surrounded by angels, and invited Isaiah to participate in God's plan of salvation. As you might imagine, terror filled Isaiah. He expressed unworthiness and great fear. God would have none of that. God promised Isaiah that he would give Isaiah what Isaiah needed. God promised to give Isaiah grace. The divine life came to Isaiah and gave him the courage to speak words of comfort and challenge to a people longing for God's presence. God ultimately worked through the prophet. God's favor was indeed upon him.

In our Gospel, the radical reaction of the disciples to Jesus' invitation inspires. They left everything and followed him. The disciples, called by Jesus, give us great examples of life in Christ. To leave everything and follow Jesus required a great deal of courage and generosity. It required faith, hope and love. God's freely offered gift of grace that gave Saint Paul the courage to say, "I am what I am," gave the first followers of Jesus the audacity to respond radically to Jesus' invitation. They gave Jesus their lives. Only by the favor of God were they able to do that.

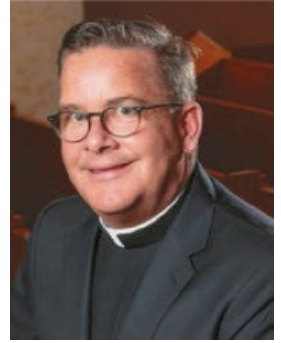
By the grace of God, we are what we are. What a great statement of faith Saint Paul humbly makes in today's second reading. It speaks volumes about Paul's own self-awareness and his right relationship with God. Only by God's grace do we even exist. Only by God's grace do we have the gifts we possess. And even though, as Saint Paul reminds us, we don't necessarily deserve God's grace, God generously showers His grace on us. And God's grace makes us what we are.

The freely offered gift, the gift of divine life, allows Christ to work through us. Paul, despite his disgraced past, despite his former persecution of those working for Christ, ultimately accepts the gift and allows the work of Christ to flow through him. Because he does, we have divinely inspired Epistles to guide us in our own pilgrimage of life. God's mercy transforms individuals and communities.

From the Pastor's Desk...

As we begin the month of February, the eyes of the Archdiocese begin to focus on the Annual Catholic Appeal. This important campaign helps continue the Catholic ministries in Wilmette, throughout the Archdiocese and around the globe. Saints Joseph and Francis Xavier Parish has historically been amazingly generous to this campaign. Every parish receives a goal based on a percentage of its ordinary income. Our goal this year is

roughly \$160,000. Whatever is pledged and donated above that goal returns to our community to fund important projects and ministries here. Archdiocesan officials distribute our \$160,000 among the following: parishes in low-income areas, the pastoral center ministries and offices, and Catholic Relief Services. On a personal note, I share with you that the Annual Catholic Appeal is one of the highest recipients of my own philanthropy, right up there with our great parish's regular collection and Catholic Charities.



Speaking of philanthropy... I am so grateful to those who have stepped up to help us refresh, refurbish, and coordinate the liturgical vestments and altar accompaniments at both of our churches. It's been a while since we have purchased any new vestments, altar cloths or other environmental additions to our sanctuaries. Jonathan Metzinger and Father Ryan have worked hard to find beautiful fabrics and vestments for both of our sanctuaries. The vestment sets cost roughly \$1,500 per. Several people heard of this project and have purchased the vestment sets in memory of loved ones. Each memorial vestment will include an embroidered name of the person remembered. I think we have about six sets left. If you would like to donate in memory of a loved one, you can contact Joe D'Arco, and he can help you with the details. The first new set will be Violet, to premiere in both churches on Ash Wednesday, March 2.

Many have asked about the lighting project at SFX. Our hope is by the end of this month we will have a contract signed for a complete restoration (not replacement of any of our beautiful fixtures) of the lighting inside of SFX church. Once the contract is signed, we will be back to you with the timing of the project.

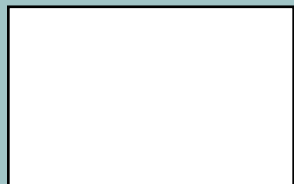

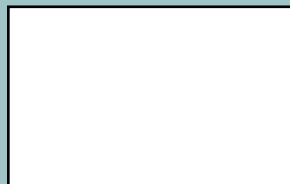

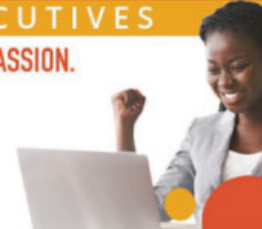
