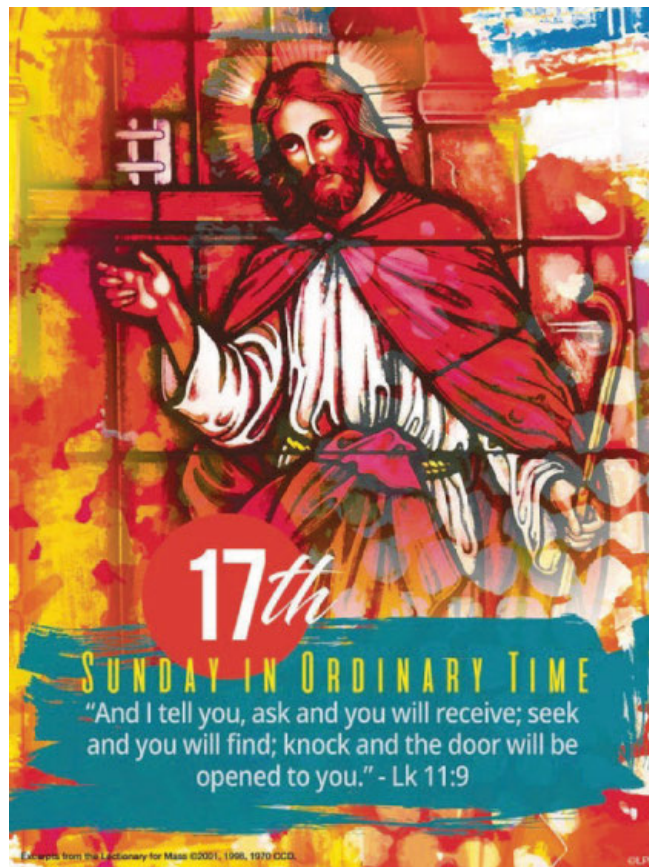

Dear Friends,

Witnessing Abraham's relationship with God challenges me to be more faithful to God, more persistent with God in prayer and to remember the importance of intercessory prayer. Abraham loved and feared God. He obeyed God and he loved the people God called him to lead. With humble persistence and with an intimate relationship only a true disciple can have, Abraham showed his love for his people as he repeatedly interceded on their behalf. In this passage from the first book of the Bible, not only do we witness the bold intimacy of Abraham, but we see God's relentless mercy.

Pope Francis often tells us that God never tires of forgiving us. I can imagine the "what ifs" in the dialogue between Abraham and God might be tiring for a mere human. *"If I find 50 innocent people..." "If I find 45..." "If I find 40..." "If I find 30..." "Twenty..." "Ten..."* God remains steadfast in his mercy.

Abraham's love for his people and his boldness in his ask inspire me. His balance of humility and confidence motivate me. God's mercy urges me on. The two characters in the Genesis story for today inspire, motivate, and urge you on as well. I pray that the words of the psalmist will be sung by you too. *"Lord, on the day I called for help, you answered me."* Singing that psalm, and truly meaning the words we sing require realizing we need help, humbly calling, and listening for God's response, which is always one of mercy.

Jesus tells us in today's Gospel of the importance of articulating our needs, of letting others, and, of course, God, know what we need from them. He assures us of the generosity of God. God will give us what we need. Period.

The disciples ask Jesus, their mentor and real example, to teach them how to pray. Jesus encourages true humility, honesty, and perseverance. Saints and theologians would call this attitude in prayer confident spiritual poverty. An honest realization that we are nothing without God, and an admittance of our dependence on God for all that we are, have and hope to accomplish, will yield great results. As Jesus teaches the disciples to pray, he reminds them and us of the key to prayer.

"And I tell you, ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you."

As you know, I have plenty of homeless and near homeless friends from my work with Catholic Charities. People who experience real material poverty know how to ask, seek, and knock. They can be bold in their requests because they know that they must be to get what they need. When my materially poor friends ask, they do so with the same

humble confidence that Abraham showed in his dialogue with his merciful God. Their boldness in making their requests gives great example to us as we, in poverty of spirit, approach our God.

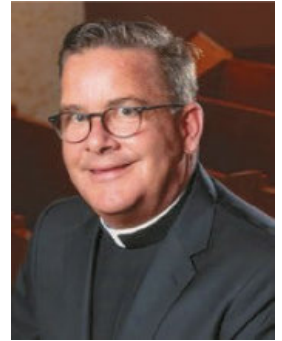
We *all* have some need. What is it you need from the Lord? What is it our unified community needs from God? Do we dare to ask? Are we afraid to seek, too proud to knock? When we follow Jesus' instructions we'll be given great gifts. Let's go together to encounter the Lord.

Speaking of asking...Sunday evening I will leave for a twelve-day pilgrimage to Lourdes and Fatima with 35 pilgrims to work and pray with the elderly and infirm in Lourdes. Some of the kids and adults are from Saints JFX. We will start our pilgrimage at 5:00pm on Sunday with a Mass at Saint Joseph Church. All are welcome to join us for the departure Mass. I ask you to keep us in your prayers that we have a safe and fruitful journey. Know that we will pray for you every day.


