

Dear Friends,

We're a couple months removed from our return from the Lourdes – Fatima pilgrimage. People often ask me why I do this trip every year. I think the excerpts from the essays of some of our young parishioners will give you the answer. We have marked the dates for next year (July 22 - August 4) and will be sending our applications soon.

There is simply a different mood, or vibe, when you are in Lourdes. Everyone you interact with has a smile on their face, it doesn't matter the situation there in, where they're from, or why they came. You can also almost always hear music playing, or bells ringing. The obvious answer to this is because of God. Being in such a holy place, one where Mary appeared to Bernadette, already makes Lourdes such a special place. It's so obvious God is watching down on us, smiling as he sees us venerating Mary to such an extent. When I think of Lourdes, I think of worship and service. In both those acts, you come together, which creates such community. This is a community I want to be a part of, stay a part of. One example that shows the Lourdes community is during the Rosary. With there being so many different languages being spoken, it is at times hard to keep track, but it also shows how many other people there are from all over the world who believe in what you believe. That in itself shows how vast God's community is, but then when everyone comes together in song and sings "Ave Maria" (Immaculate Mary) it's truly beautiful. Although the Rosary is split up in different languages, every person in every language knows the song and they sing it. Singing that holding our candles high with the other kids along with adults and the entire congregation showed me I belong.

It was awesome to see the joy that the malades had as we visited different places around the shrine, regardless of their situation. I think I really grew in my prayer life while visiting

Lourdes and strengthened my relationship with God.

When reflecting on the most impactful part of our pilgrimage to Lourdes, I often think back to our visit to Cenacolo. I was impressed by their strength and their humility, as it surely took a lot to talk about their past struggles in front of a room of teenagers. Not only was I touched by their stories, but I was fascinated by their dedication to Providence more. I began to think back to the story that one of the men talked about his visit to India, and how a little girl was happy even living in the streets of Calcutta. His interaction led me to recall the smiling faces at St. Thomas of Canterbury food pantry after receiving a fresh bag of apples, or the smiling faces of the children at Madonna Mission tutoring after grasping a concept they were struggling with. This made me realize how God's love is always enough, and by trusting in his love, you will always be satisfied. Even when it feels like you have nothing, you always have God - sometimes knowing he is there watching over you is all the Providence you need.



Saints JFX Parish partners with Family Promise Chicago North Shore (FP) (www.familypromisechicagons.org) to provide support for local <u>families</u> in need of short-term assistance who are temporarily without housing. FP is a nonprofit, non-denominational organization. They help families with children in homeless situations to quickly Return to permanent housing, usually within 2-3 months. FP provides short term shelter, meals, job search assistance and other support for families, while working to address the causes of their homelessness. Guests are fully vetted and drug screened before entering the program.

Saints JFX Parish helps FP by providing housing for the guests from 6:00 pm until 7:00 am each night for a week or two at one time; 2-3 times a year. Parishioners provide dinner and socialize with the guests. Housing is provided at the old Convent building at the St. Joseph campus. Our next hosting dates are October 2<sup>nd</sup> – October 16<sup>6h</sup>. Cleaning the convent will be October 1<sup>st</sup> from 1:00 - 2:00 pm at the Convent. Boys & Men are needed to help move furniture.

### Please Consider a QCD gift for Our Parish

You can help to support our parish and cover our increased operating costs by making a qualified charitable distribution ("QCD") gift from your individual retirement account.

A QCD gift (a.k.a. IRA charitable rollover) allows individuals age 70½ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to make a direct transfer of funds from their IRA to qualified charities, tax-free. This way of giving does not generate taxable income, which may lower your annual income level. If you are age 72 or older, the amount you transfer may count towards your required minimum distribution.




