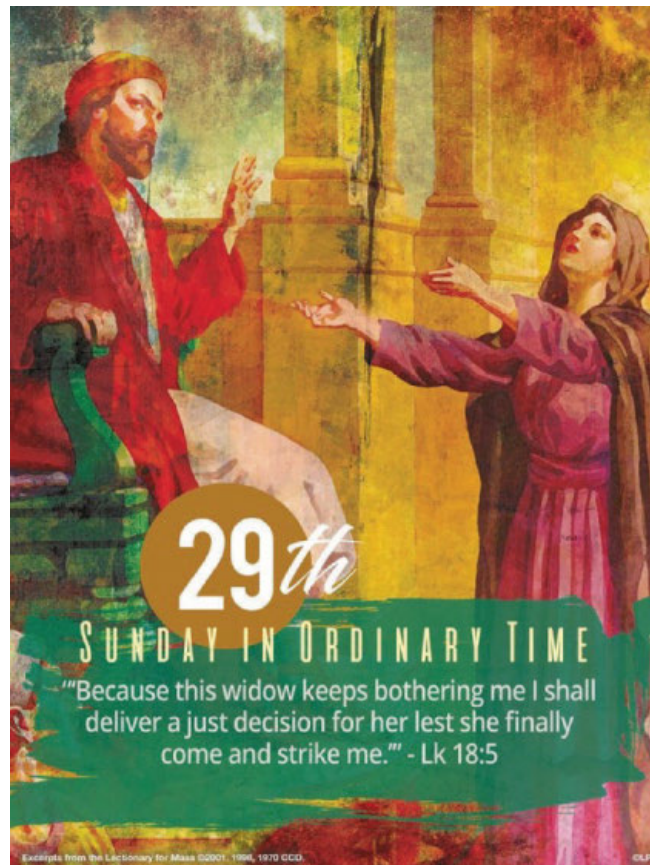

Dear Friends,

The first Bible reading this weekend is a wonderful story about Moses in prayer. He lifted his arms high over the battle, received the support of those attending him, made sure Israel won the fight. Arms up - they win. Arms droop - they fade. Does it always work that way with prayer? Do you think it works that way for me and you?

“Lord, I want a million dollars!” Nothing. Maybe we shouldn’t pray to gain something. Maybe we should pray to lose something.

“Lord, help me lose 30-pounds!” Still there. Maybe we shouldn’t pray to gain or lose. Maybe the arms business works only if you pray to maintain something.

Let me try it. “Lord, let me keep my good looks!” Who laughed?

Could the simple samples mean that prayer is not a matter of demand and response? Have we become addicted to quick answers? How angry do you get when the channel doesn’t change? How frustrating is it to stand in the long grocery store line? How fast are we to utter the exclamation when the internet search slows up? We expect immediate answers, even to prayers. Perhaps we have confused prayer with the fairy tale about the genie in the bottle.

Still, the arms must stay up. The prayer has to be as persistent as the widow in the Gospel, as consistent as the wingspan of Moses.

“Lord, deepen the marriage. Keep that fire lit. Increase our love for each other. Remind us we promised to approach you together.” There is no immediate answer. Keep the arms up. Pray.

Christ, keep our kids safe. This week a friend reminded me that something hurting her kids always stings more than something that happens to her. She and you continue by meaning what you say. “Keep my kids from the temptations of alcohol, drugs, quick pleasures, being spoiled, foul language, being a bully, losing, lack of respect, dishonesty.” If we recite such a prayer when the child is a baby, how much does it mean as one life era flips on to another? No immediate answer. Keep the arms up. Pray.

“Jesus, heal my crumby health. Blow away loneliness. Show me your face when I have to go to another doctor’s appointment, another test, another shot. Stop me from falling apart as the discarded calendar sheets block me from being able to do what I used to do every day. Stop

me from getting old when I don’t have time for that.” No answer. As if I could wait. Keep the arms up. Pray.

“My God, strengthen Saints JFX. This parish is on a winning streak. Don’t let us lose. Never let us lose. Make people proud of the Catholic Church in Wilmette. Show me you also live on the North Shore. What will our parish look like next month, next season, next year?” Nobody has heard that answer yet. Keep the arms up. Pray.

“Christ, how about peace in the Ukraine, on the borders, during a snotty political ad, on the streets of Chicago, in the northeast corner of Cook County?” No answer. Not now. Keep the arms up. Pray.

My arms are tired. I have a caretaker; people volunteer; over the past six years, I have made friends. But keeping my arms up is an embarrassing request for me to make. I don’t have the heavyweight helpers like Moses had, bowing to my command, listening to me whine, ignoring my grumbles and barks or changing the subject. What comes next? Read the Bible story again. Exodus 17: 8-13. Keep the arms up. Pray.

Then look to Him on the Cross. Those arms never fall.

For everyone, there are events that leave a mark with a lasting imprint on the way each of us perceives things. Your wedding day, the birthdate of your first child, the afternoon you were fired, the hour you were negatively diagnosed, the moment you fell in love – all these times permanently changed the way you saw yourself and your world. Five years ago this past week, I myself stumbled across one such day. Now I see myself and my world in a different light. I also understand that today is a gift that gives me the opportunity – not the promise – to enjoy tomorrow. For that definite change in my vision, I thank God. I ask Him to grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change, the courage to change the things I can, and the wisdom to know the difference. Amen,

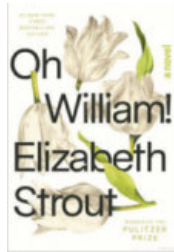
**OUR PARISH BOOK OF THE DEAD**

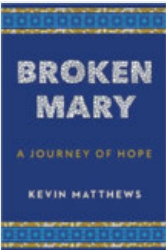
**Saints JFX Book Club**

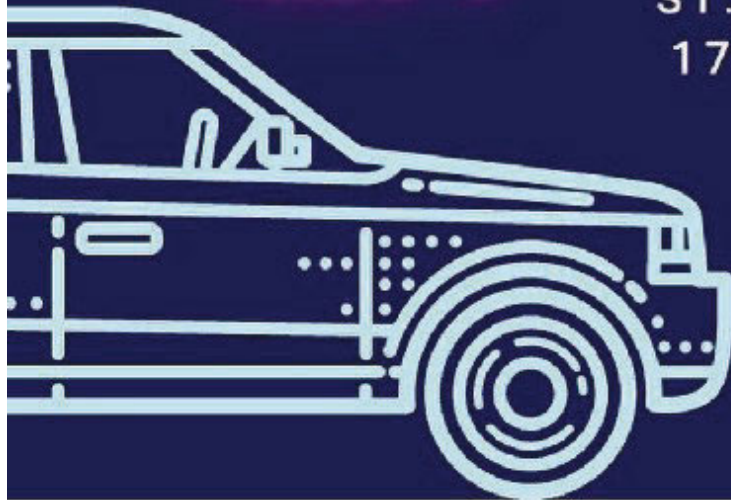

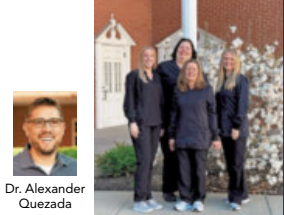
