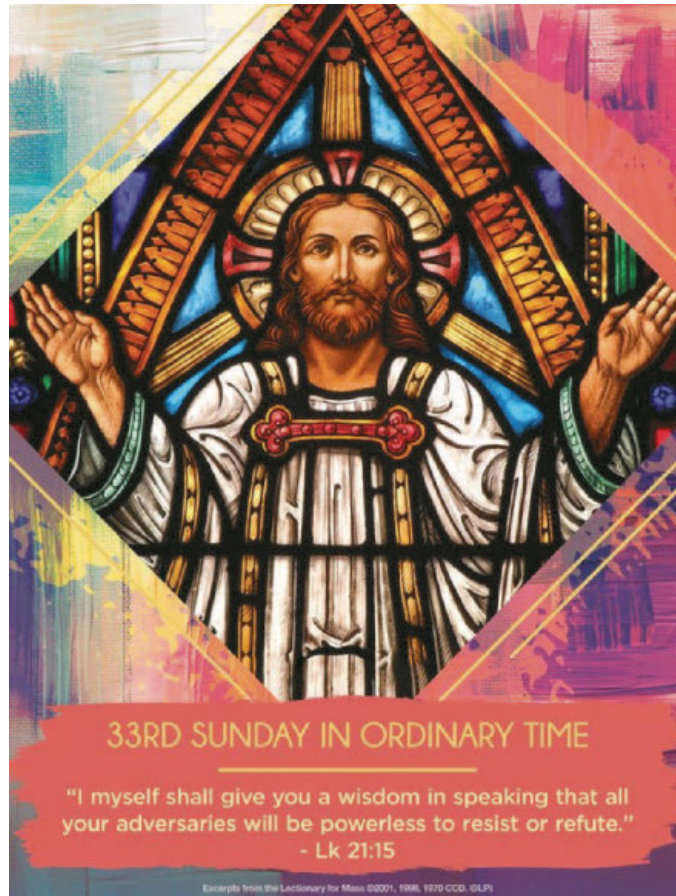

## Marriage Banns

Dear Friends,

Being “*devoted*” to God comes up twice in the prayers of the Mass this weekend. As I prayed over the prayers and the readings for the Mass, the expression struck a chord in me. Often, we read in obituaries of deceased people that they were “*devoted*” husbands or wives, parents, or children. Webster gives a definition of the adjective as “very loving or loyal,” with synonyms “loyal, faithful, true, true blue, staunch, steadfast, constant, committed, dedicated, devout, fond, loving, admiring, affectionate, caring, attentive, warm, and ardent.” The verb “devote,” according to the same source suggests “giving all or part of one’s time or resources to (a person, activity or cause.)”

With those definitions in mind, read the prayers the priest prays this weekend on your behalf. When the congregation responds amen at the end of the priest’s prayer, it signals an assent, or an agreement with the prayer offered by the priest in the name of those gathered. When we say, “Amen,” we say, “So be it!” In the collect, as we begin the Mass for the thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary time, we pray, “*Grant us, we pray, O Lord our God, **the constant gladness of being devoted to you, for it is full and lasting happiness to serve with constancy the author of all that is good. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.***”

And in the Prayer Over the Offerings, the priest prays, “*Grant, O Lord, we pray, that what we offer in the sight of your majesty may **obtain for us the grace of being devoted to you and gain us the prize of everlasting happiness. Through Christ our Lord.***”

So, we ask for the gladness and the grace of being very loving and loyal to God, faithful to God, dedicated to God, true blue, staunch and committed to God. We recognize that this commitment to the “author of all that is good” will bring true and lasting happiness.

Practically speaking, though, devotion requires work. Today, many other outlets scream for our attention, our devotion, our commitment.

I remember the year that my niece hoped to join the annual pilgrimage to Lourdes. Joining the group would have required her to miss the first two days of the summer practice for whatever team she was hoping to join at her Catholic high school. She was told by the coach that if she missed the first two days of practice, she would not make the team. She ended up forgoing the pilgrimage - and regrets it to this day. I wish she never had to be put in that situation as a sixteen-year-old.

Devotion to God requires sacrifice. It demands discipline, steadfastness, courage, and singlemindedness. It offers, though, full and lasting happiness. Jesus encourages us to keep trying, to persevere. In the final words of today’s Gospel, Jesus tells us, “By your perseverance you will secure your lives.”



As I read the words to those gathered at Mass at the Shirley Ryan Ability Lab this week, I looked out at a group of patients who had been working diligently on their own rehabilitation. They all had their own histories and programs, and each had a serious prognosis, but they persevered, in their physical rehab and in their spiritual life.

Perseverance in prayer took on a new meaning when I visited a patient in his room at SRALab. He was suffering the effects of a stroke that left him partially paralyzed and with limited speech. We prayed the prayers of the anointing of the sick. As I began the prayer, “In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit,” he pulled his hand from under the sheet, and, in slow motion, made the sign of the cross. And when we prayed the Our Father, I could see his lips move and hear him whisper the prayer. By his perseverance he will indeed secure his life.

I’m inspired this week to devote myself more completely to the author of all that is good. Won’t you join me?

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

In so many ways—large and small—the pandemic has upended our lives together. Families and, in a special way, young people, have faced distressing struggles. The pandemic made our connections with one another challenging and difficult. Exactly in that moment when we truly needed supportive relationships with one another, we found ourselves separated. Sadly, this included the relationships and connections that we have in and through the Church.

We did our best to move forward and I am proud of our collective response to the challenges of the pandemic. When I announced a general dispensation from the obligation to participate in Sunday Mass, many parishes offered on-line Sunday Masses, and went even further and established prayer lines and reached out to those in need. The TV Mass that I celebrated helped to keep us connected as a community of faith in Chicagoland. So many of you have told me how healing and comforting those Masses have been.

In the meanwhile, we are in a new moment. With vaccinations and boosters, restrictions on public gatherings have eased up. Many people feel more comfortable returning to Church. Yet, we know there are some elderly and immuno-compromised persons who are still not ready to return. And they should not return. These vulnerable brothers and sisters have an excusing cause for being absent and for this reason I will continue the TV Mass on ABC for the present time. But for the rest of us, I have decided, in consultation with my advisors, to lift the general dispensation from the obligation of attending Sunday Mass as we begin a new Church year on the First Sunday of Advent, November 26-27.

My hope is that the First Sunday of Advent will provide us with a fresh start to take up again our life together as a community of faith that gathers to worship God. I have asked our pastors to begin the Masses on November 26-27 with the traditional lighting of the Advent wreath. After the homily your pastor will lead the community in a renewal of baptismal promises, acknowledging that we owe our obligation to participate in Sunday Mass to God but also to each other. Our common profession of faith and of our desire to turn away from sin, will be concluded by a sprinkling rite with the waters of baptism.

Let this occasion of our renewal of faith and life, which we all so much want, provide us with a fresh start as we recommit ourselves to worship God and to be supportive of each other week after week as we gather around the Table of the Lord to be nourished and renewed.

### Pack the Plane to Ukraine

With Ukraine under siege and in desperate need of food and medical supplies, Saints JFX parishioners Natasha and Vitaliy Poylin swung into action. He's a Ukrainian-born surgeon who went to medical school in Kyiv and is now at Northwestern University; she's a trauma surgery nurse practitioner at University of Chicago Medicine.

Together, they created Pack the Plane to Ukraine, a nonprofit organization sending humanitarian and medical supplies to border refugee camps and hospitals in Ukraine. After spending \$15,000 personally on their mission, the Poylins contacted The Society of St. Vincent de Paul, St. Francis Xavier/St. Joseph Conference for help with shipping costs. There are no administrative costs to Pack the Plane; it's run out of the Poylins' garage and Vitaliy's office, with assistance from friends and their four children.



St. Vincent de Paul volunteers joined the Poylins to pack boxes in their garage and provided \$10,000 to help pay for shipping costs. Pack the Plane has shipped 14,550 pounds of humanitarian and medical goods (all donated) that have a conservative monetary value of \$200,000. Humanitarian supplies include diapers, food, soaps, shampoo, dental products, and blankets. Medical equipment includes surgical instruments, suture materials, feeding tubes and tracheotomy kits.

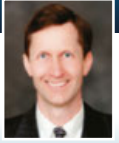
