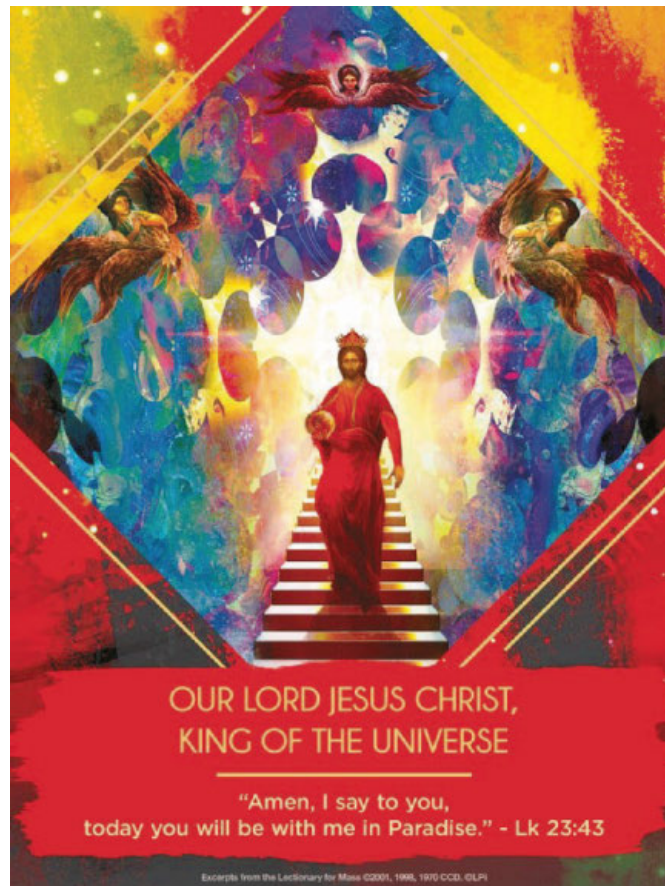

Dear Friends,

I'd like to tell you about a woman that our Saints JFX Society of St. Vincent de Paul helped very recently. She had been living in the dark for several months because she was ashamed to tell anyone that her electricity had been shut off (she would always arrange to meet at a friend's home). St. Vincent de Paul got the electricity back on, helped her with food cards (she was rationing her own food to feed her pets), and supported a needed car repair so she could access employment services. Now, she is in the final stages of the interview process, and she hopes to start a new job soon!

I'm sharing this story because it's a good example of much of the work that we do through St. Vincent de Paul. Like many of the people we support, this woman had fallen on hard times. She felt ashamed of her circumstances and didn't want her friends to know about her difficulties. We hear that a lot and we always treat the people we help with respect and dignity. We listen supportively, and we help in very practical ways to get things back on track. The story ends with her returning to the job market so she can resume taking care of herself. Our goal is **always** to assist people so they can get back on their own feet.

At St. Vincent de Paul, we sometimes think of ourselves as the "fire department" that quickly helps put out a financial crisis and then connects people to longer-term support. We are generally able to move very swiftly – providing financial support within a few days.

Assisting individuals and families in financial or personal crisis is our number one ministry. Even here on the affluent North Shore we hear from dozens of families each year who find themselves in serious trouble due to job loss, medical expenses, or other challenges. They are at risk of eviction, having their gas or electricity shut off or simply in need of food or clothing. Typically, we interview each person who contacts us, in person when possible. A decision is then made as to what, if any, short term help would be appropriate and make a difference.

For example, we might pay a month's rent or some past due utility bills, or provide pre-loaded grocery store, Target, or gas cards. We have provided Christmas presents for children whose parents are financially unable to do so. In recent years we have also provided significant assistance to refugee families living in St. Thomas of Canterbury parish. When needs go beyond our capabilities we refer clients to Catholic Charities and other agencies.

Importantly, we keep everything very confidential and preserve the client's dignity. **It is your support, through the Thanksgiving collection**, that enables us to meet these needs and provide a short bridge to families and individuals who need one. This is the only fundraising that we do all year and funds all our support work.

During the past year, our Conference was also involved in other ministries, including:

- Making sandwiches and sack lunches for the poor
- Assembling/donating dignity kits for released prisoners in Cook County.
- Supporting two new ministries: Pack the Plan to Ukraine – sending medical and humanitarian supplies to war victims; staffing a Disaster Recovery Center set up by the FBI and Red Cross in Highland Park for those injured in the July 4 Parade, and meeting with and helping many of those victims.
- Extending a financial lifeline to those unable to buy groceries or pay rent, utilities, or medical bills
- Providing food for St. Thomas of Canterbury and other food pantries
- Delivering flowers to the homebound during the holidays

July 4 Highland Park Disaster Recovery

As our community and nation grieved in the aftermath of the July 4 parade shooting, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul received an urgent call from the FBI and Red Cross. Could we help staff a Disaster Recovery Center at the Highland Park High School? Area residents and employees struggling with physical wounds, emotional scars, and lost income due to temporarily closed businesses needed support.

Members of the St. Francis Xavier/St. Joseph Conference met with 25 injured community members and listened to their experiences, offered emotional support, and provided financial assistance. Simultaneous translators helped us communicate with victims who spoke only Spanish.

Our visitors included a young man with a bullet lodged in his back awaiting future surgery, a grandmother who broke her leg while shielding her grandchildren at the parade, and the mother of a boy who narrowly escaped being shot on a parade float and struggles with PTSD. After our meetings, we followed up by email or phone to assure residents of our concern for them, check on their progress, and determine how best we could assist financially.

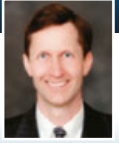
