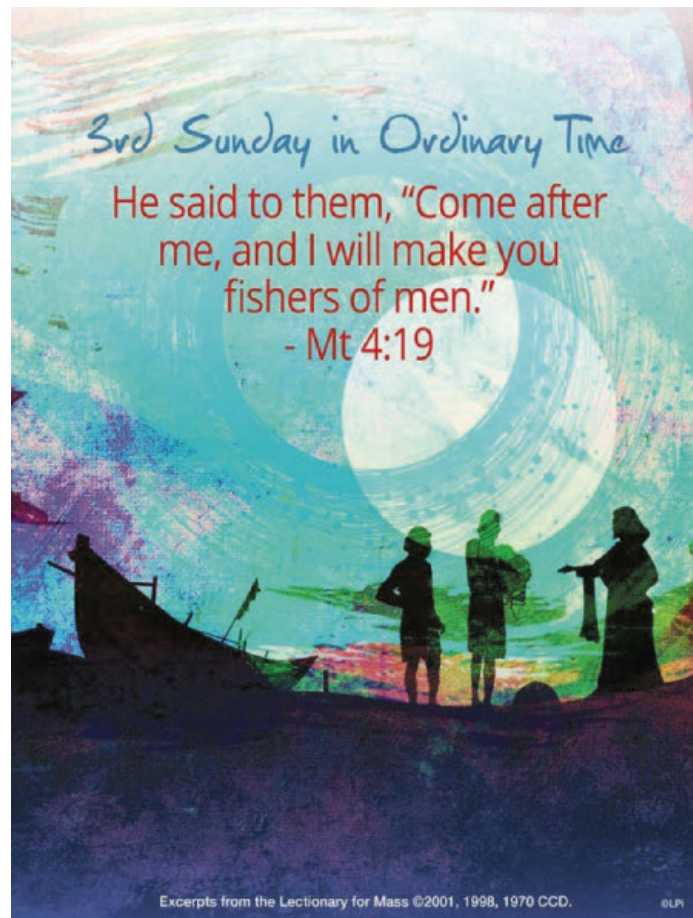

Dear Friends,

The psalm for today reminds us that the Lord is our light and our salvation. We need to remember that. As we look for light and seek salvation, we ought to turn to the Lord, who provides just that, out of his mercy and his love. Since before Christmas, I have been reflecting on this passage from the Prophet Isaiah. ***Anguish has taken wing, dispelled is darkness: for there is no gloom where but now there was distress. The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; upon those who dwelt in the land of gloom a light has shone.*** Perhaps it has been on the forefront of my mind because the darkness of war and poverty and violence seems so heavy. I think it is because I realize just how much we need the light of Christ.

The Church offers this reading at the midnight Mass on Christmas, and in case we are sleeping at that time, it gives us a reprise today. The light of Christ has come. Jesus brings the light of God's mercy and of God's love into a darkened world. He calls and invites us to participate in the mission of light bearing. In the midst of everything else we are doing – and we all like to talk about how busy we are – Jesus calls us to share our light, his light, with the world. Jesus is calling YOU to share your gifts - and share his light.

Have you ever heard your name being called, in the house or in your office and felt tempted to pretend you were you unable to hear the call? Have you ever looked at the caller ID on your phone as it rang and decided, because of the identification of the caller, not to answer? Do you screen your calls?

I am amazed by the willingness of the disciples to hear the call of the Lord and their eagerness to drop everything and respond to the call of the Lord. They didn't say, "please hold," or pretend that they didn't hear Jesus. Too often we allow things to prevent us from hearing the Lord's call. Maybe we're afraid of what he might ask of us; perhaps we are too busy doing what we want to do. The immediacy of the response of those being called strikes me. What's getting in the way of our response to God's call? The fisherman, I'm sure, could have said they were too busy with their daily tasks to heed Jesus as he beckoned them.

What about us? Are we being called to change our ways? Do we possess attitudes unbecoming of a child of God? Are we bearing light to a darkened world? The call to discipleship - intentional discipleship - rings today as it did when Jesus said, "Come follow me" to those he met on the seashore. In today's terms it means being generous with who we are. Our time, talent and treasure belong to us - but are gifts from God. It's time to forget excuses and answer the call to share them. Hear the call. Follow Jesus. Give of self. You will be happy you did.



I'm incredibly impressed and grateful for the overwhelming response from the men of this great parish to rebuild and reignite the Men's Club. Deepak Devaraj and John Celentani have been planning. They sent blanket emails inviting men to step up. The leadership met last week. Watch for more details in the coming weeks, and for an invitation to the inaugural meeting in February.

So, the Lord continues to call us. The challenge for Christians today is to stop saying we are too busy to be involved in the life of the Church, in the mission of Jesus Christ. We all have busy lives, full schedules. I encourage you to prioritize participation in the mission of Jesus as you plan your schedule in this new year. There are so many ways to get involved at Saints JFX.

Hear the voice. Don't ignore it.  
Respond immediately.

**The Saints JFX Knitting Ministry helps the Refugees**

One Sunday last fall Fr. Watts explained that many refugees were coming to Chicago, and Catholic Charities was involved in helping the people adjust and settle into their new lives here. The Knitting Ministry took the message to heart and for over three months our members from near and far started making items of warmth that include scarves, neck warmers, headbands, and hats. People sent finished projects from Arizona, some dropped items off on their way to Florida, and others recruited relatives to work on this project. Parishioner Kerry Suse, who is involved in the Building Peaceful Bridges Program, came to the December 14th meeting and explained the mission of this organization which further inspired us. By January over 125 items were completed and ready for distribution. Kerry returned to the January 11th Knitting Ministry meeting to take the wrapped items for the recipients to help keep them warm in 2023.

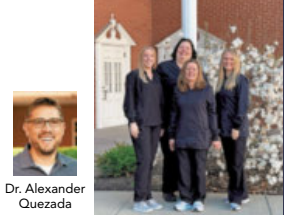

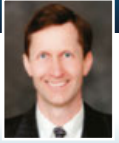
