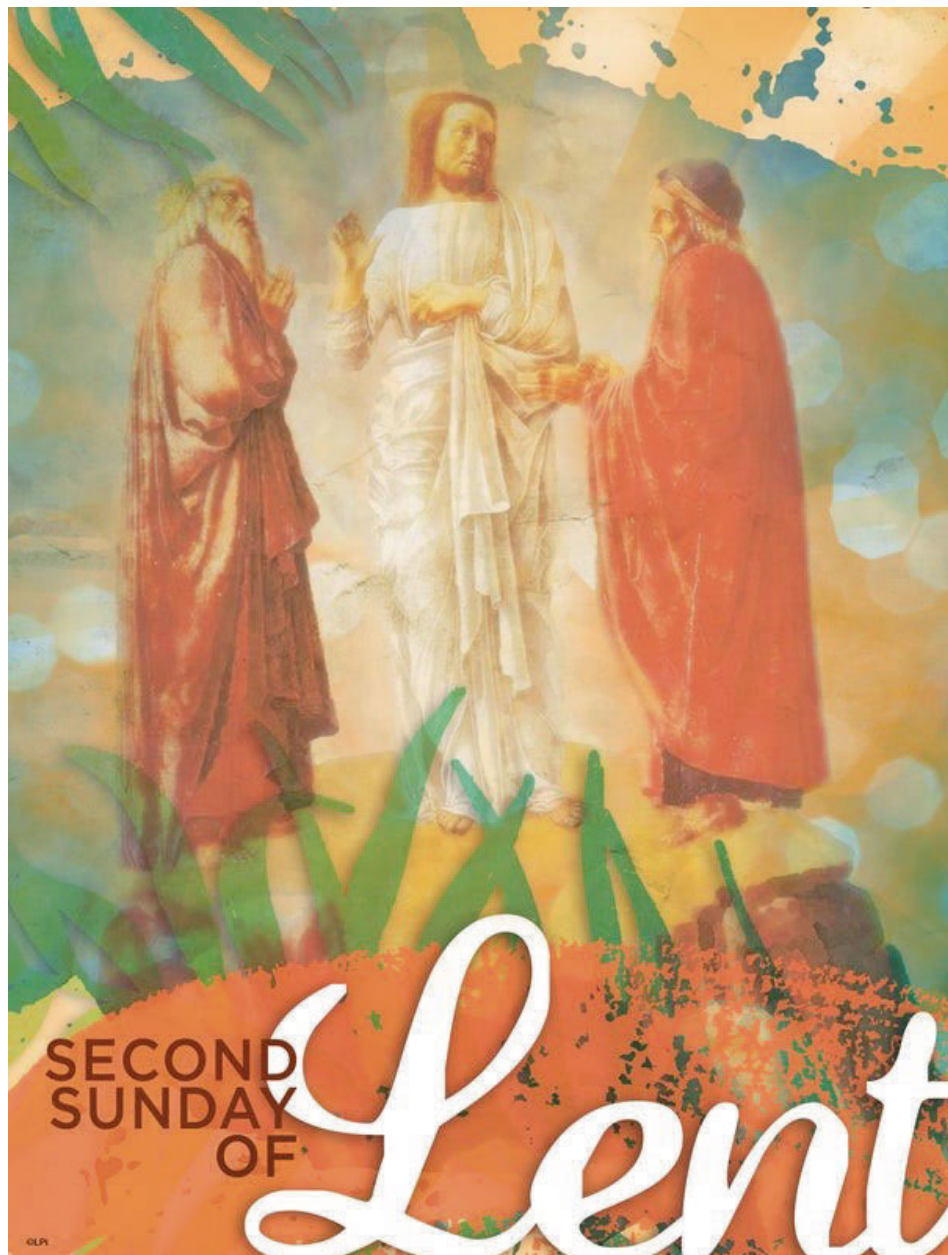

Dear Friends,

From the Pastor's Desk

This week we began three great initiatives, ***The Disciple Maker Index (DMI) Parish Survey, the Saints JFX Men's Club, and the Campus Master Plan Study.*** Allow me to inform you on all three.

We blasted the parish survey to your inbox (maybe more than once. I'm sorry for the flood of emails). The DMI is like the survey we completed a couple of years ago. We listened to what you said then and we will listen again and continue to grow and respond to the needs of you, our stakeholders, and fellow disciples. I strongly encourage everyone to complete the survey (by the end of this month). It takes 10-15 minutes to complete. Our last survey produced great results. The DMI promises to do the same.

On Wednesday night a group of men gathered in the Saint Joseph convent "Men's Club Room" to inaugurate the newly constituted Saints JFX Men's Club. The Men's Club will build community, with a three-pillar focus on service, social events, and spirituality. There will be something for everyone and all are welcome to share their gifts. We will also use the meetings to keep people up to date on all the exciting things that are happening in the Parish. I thank John Celentani, Peter Couri and Tim Horton for leading the charge, and the enthusiastic team around them.

On Thursday, the steering committee of the Campus Master Plan Initiative met virtually with the Lakota Group to map out a plan for the project. The committee, headed by Eric Anderson includes members of the community representing as many constituencies as possible. The members are, Chris Canning, Joe D'Arco, Christine Elliott, JP Gallagher, Jennifer Gervasio, Jill Hayes, Mike Henn, Maura Morgan, Dan Neely, George Pearce, and Sue Webb. These members of this committee will serve as representatives of our community to guide and oversee the campus master planning process with the community's best interest in mind.

In the Gospel today, we join Jesus, along with Peter, James and John on Tabor, the Mountain of the Transfiguration. As we are beginning our Lenten discipline, we can echo Peter's words to Jesus, "It is good for us to be here!" Indeed, it is good for us to be here – literally and figuratively. It is good for us to be here, at Mass today, listening to the Scriptures and receiving our Lord. It is good to do those things. Our Church teaches that celebrating Holy Eucharist is the most important thing a Catholic can do. Each Mass can be a mini-transfiguration moment.

Pope Francis, in his message for Lent, uses the Transfiguration story and gives us two paths to guide us on our Lenten journey. The first path has to do with the command that God the Father addresses to the disciples on Mount Tabor as they contemplate Jesus transfigured. The voice from the cloud says: *"Listen to him" (Mt 17:5). The first proposal, then, is very clear: we need to listen to Jesus... First, in the word of God, which the Church offers us in the liturgy. May that word not fall on deaf ears. In addition to the Scriptures, the Lord speaks to us through our brothers and sisters, especially in the faces and the stories of those who are in need. The second proposal for this Lent: do not take refuge in a religiosity made up of extraordinary events and dramatic experience, but in the ordinary life of our communities."*



Transfiguration experience permitted the disciples to get a glimpse of the happiness of Heaven before they descended the hill to continue on the road to Calvary. During Lent we walk with Jesus toward the Cross, with a keen awareness of the promise that Cross offers us. On this second Sunday of Lent, we get the same glimpse the disciples did, to strengthen us in our Lenten resolve. On Mount Tabor, the disciples heard a voice from Heaven that reminded them of whom they were joining, and what they were supposed to do. "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased. Listen to him."

Certainly, experiencing the vision of the Transfiguration and the celestial voice brought great joy and struck the disciples with awe. Amid the awe and joy, they were reminded that they too had a role to play. They were told to listen. The first words spoken to them by Jesus, "Rise and do not be afraid," instruct not just the disciples, but also all of us. We must listen, then rise and fearlessly commit to doing the will of God. We can do this if we follow the psalmist's lead and put our trust in God.

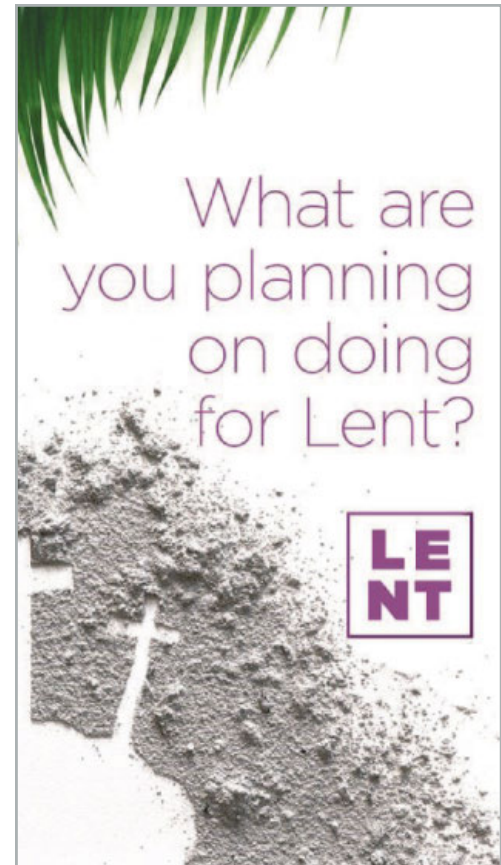
