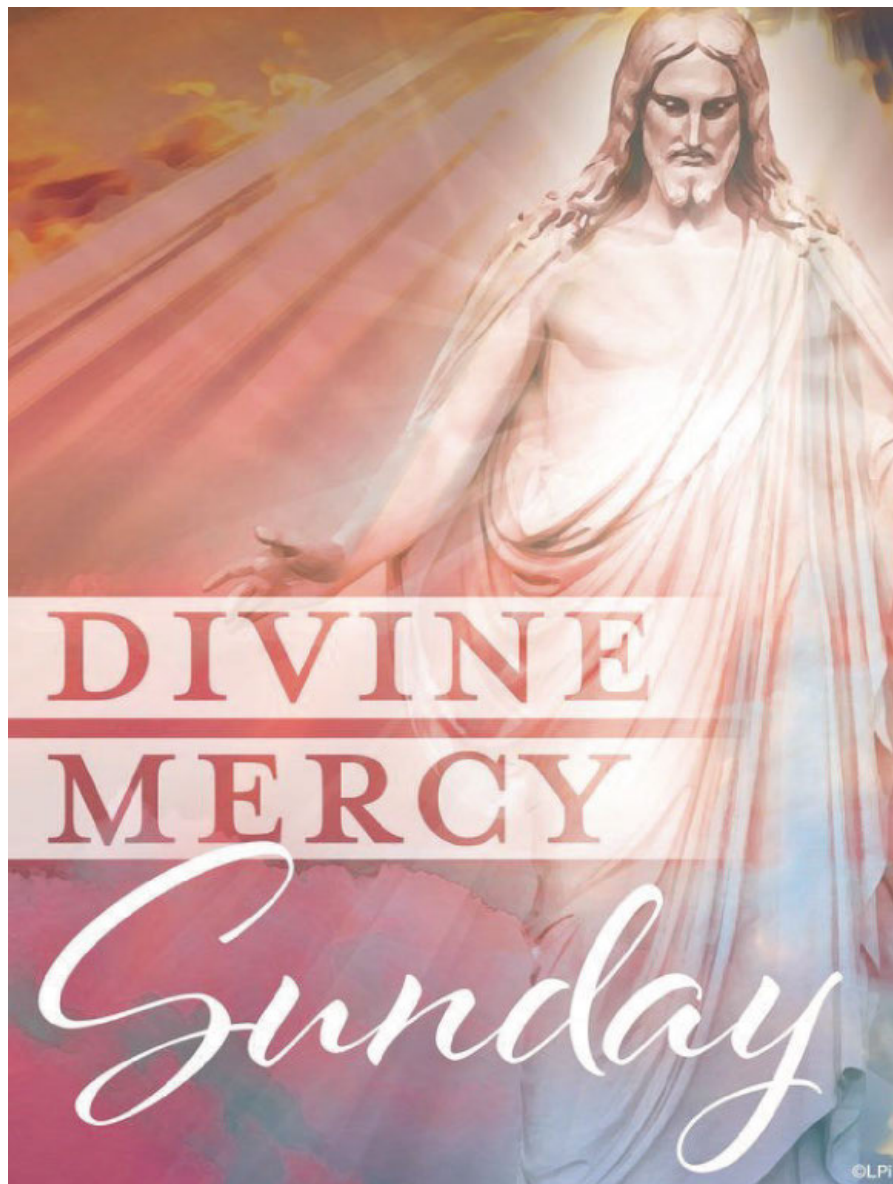

Alleluia, He is risen! He is risen indeed!

Happy and blessed Easter! This holiest of seasons contains too much joy and celebration for a single day. Instead, the Easter season continues for fifty days of celebration – which is longer than Lent!

In the Catholic faith, Easter Day is more than a single day; it is an Octave of days, concluding today on Divine Mercy Sunday. All this week, we have been celebrating Easter Sunday, whose mystery pours out into the other days of the week, sanctifying them in a new way in grace and celebration. What began with the resurrection, from Christ breaking the prison bars of death and rising to new life, cannot be contained, challenged, or diminished. The glory of God's victory changes everything that ever was and ever will be and brings forth new life into the world.

Today on Divine Mercy Sunday, our Gospel proclaims the challenges of belief. Thomas had not experienced the risen Christ with the others, and his broken heart could not handle their excitement. Often called "Doubting Thomas," he was still wounded from the shame of leaving Jesus and may have struggled with feeling left out with all of his friends proclaiming, "He is alive!" But then, in his great mercy, Jesus Christ, God himself, reveals himself to Thomas. He shows Thomas, and us, his own wounds so that we will not be scandalized to show him ours. It's in this very brokenness of life that Christ pours out his Divine love and mercy, healing every wound, forgiving every sin, breathing life into the dead places of our hearts, so that, like Thomas, the only proper proclamation is, "My Lord and my God!"

And even still, the Easter celebration continues. When I teach the second graders, we discuss how Jesus "hung out with his friends for 40 more days" after the resurrection. Jesus still had lessons to teach, and only after we had been set free from sin could we begin to understand. During this time, the Apostles and disciples of Christ were unpacking all Christ had told them in his public ministry.

In our readings and prayers at Mass, we also continue to unpack the meaning of his sayings and teachings in a period called *mystagogy*, meaning "to lead through the mysteries." Christ and the Church continue to lead us through the Paschal mystery – life, death, and resurrection – leading to the Ascension of Christ and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

Our Easter mystagogical experience is a type of spiritual formation in preparation for the rest of our lives as Christians. The Easter season serves as an opportunity to grow in prayer and gratitude for family, friends, and many graces in our life. We recognize that we are on a journey of the heart with Christ to a place of refreshment, light, and peace that only life everlasting may give us. In short, just like we should not be the same person, with the same habits and vices on Easter Sunday as we were on Ash Wednesday, so too on Pentecost, we should have a deeper relationship with the Holy Trinity than we did on Easter Sunday.

In a way, this is where the real challenge begins because we are free to use the gifts and grace of our life as we see fit. We do not have communal fasting and abstaining from meat as we had in Lent. We do not have a Parish Reconciliation service during Easter. We do not have a culture of communal prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Still, instead, it is on us to live these Christian virtues, to seek the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist moving forward because we desire to live a life closer to Christ, in witness to the resurrection and life for the world to come.

Ultimately, we are preparing for the great commission and the power of the Holy Spirit. As Christians, we are commanded to go out and share the Good News and the joy of the Gospel with our life. We prepare our hearts with the Paschal Mystery to be prepared for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit's power in our hearts at Pentecost. The Easter celebration and season prepare us for a life of witness, gratitude, and joy. Life is different because of the resurrection of Jesus Christ; this is why we say "He is risen," not He has risen or was risen.

As the Saints JFX community of faith, let us live a life of joy and gratitude as we proclaim together the Good News, "ALLELUIA, HE IS RISEN!"

I am married to Laura Granros, who grew up in suburban Minneapolis and currently works as a school psychologist at a middle school in Glenview. We recently moved to Wilmette with our children, Santiago Ryotan, who is a first grader at St. Francis Xavier, and Nina, who is a preschooler at Saint Joseph. We are very grateful to be part of the vibrant and loving SJFX school community. We spend holidays with our families and enjoy visits to Brazil to see relatives and friends.

Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) is the main consultative body of the parish and exercises shared responsibility for the Pastoral life of the parish with the Pastor. This includes defining parish goals, setting broad strategies for implementing those goals, and evaluating the parish's success in carrying out the Church's mission.

The council represents a cross section of the parish. Meetings are held on the 3rd Monday of the month, September - June. In addition to monthly meetings, members are asked to serve on sub-committees such as Stewardship, Hospitality, and Youth Faith Formation. This past year, one of our key accomplishments was the completion of a parish-wide survey.

Terms are 3 years, and the preferred number of members is 12. PPC has in-person meetings on the third Monday of the month at 7:30 pm. Work involves around 5 hours a month.

Finance Council assists the Pastor in discharging his responsibilities in the administration, management, and stewardship of the financial affairs of the parish. The Finance Council works with the Pastor and the Director of Operations in preparing and approving the annual budget, overseeing and approving major capital expenditures, producing and communicating the Annual Report of the Parish Finances to Parishioners as well as reviewing the operating results and providing important guidance in the financial management of the parish.

Meetings are held on the 4th Monday of the month, September - June. In addition to the monthly meeting, council volunteers are asked to work on sub-committees to actively work on Parish finance projects. Terms are 3 years and the preferred number of volunteers for the Finance Council is between 9 and 12.

The council is open to all parishioners and strives to have a mix of professional backgrounds including, but not limited to, finance, accounting, legal, marketing, consulting, and fundraising from both parish and school individuals across a range of age groups.

The Stewardship Committee works to stimulate Parish life and involvement through a variety of initiatives including coordinating area parties and parish events, welcoming new parishioners, spearheading the annual Ministry Fair, and organizing fundraising efforts when needed. We rely on the creative energy and contributions from a wide range of parishioners from multiple generations and backgrounds and invite you to join us!

Meetings are held on the 2nd Monday of the month. Volunteer opportunities are organized around our subcommittees including Hospitality, Time & Talent, Communications and Treasure. Terms are 3 years and the preferred number of volunteers for the Stewardship Committee is between 12 and 15. The committee is open to all parishioners .

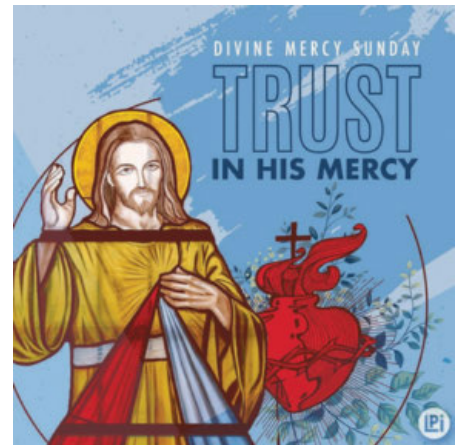

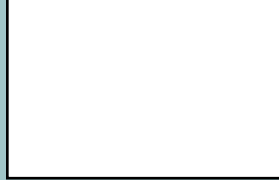
