

So as we experience this time of unprecedented uncertainty, when fear and maybe even despair knock on our doors, Jesus reminds even us that He is God, He is powerful and He will help us.

Saint Paul, in his beautiful Letter to the Ephesians that we hear today, gives us a great challenge - really several of them, as we seek perfection in the spiritual life. He says, "Live as children of the light." "Take no part in the fruitless works of darkness." And "Try to learn what is pleasing to the Lord." As children of the light, we can bring the light of Christ's love, mercy and compassion to a world that sorely
