Dear Friends,

Share. As I read the Scriptures for this weekend, this important verb comes to my mind. Isaiah invites the people to share what they have and promises great reward. Paul speaks of sharing his love for Jesus and the promise that brings. Jesus reminds his followers that they are salt and light and encourages them to share that light with the world. Unshared light leaves the world in darkness. Nothing we have or are is only for ourselves. Jesus encourages us, in today's Gospel and throughout his earthly ministry, to share what we have. He ensures us that when we share, great things will happen.

*Come, follow me...
and heal our world.*

Before we know it, the three weeks of the Annual Catholic Appeal process will begin. I write because I have experienced my own conversion with regard to the appeal and the process. I know that many don't care for the process and find the in-pew solicitation tedious. I appreciate those sentiments but invite you to consider the benefits to our parish, local and universal Church, and, for the sake of the proclamation of the Word, here and beyond, to support the Annual Catholic Appeal with a generous pledge. I will.

When I first became a pastor 14 years ago, the appeal came on the heels of my January appointment. I didn't do anything significant to support the appeal. I was too busy, I thought, attending to the daily needs of our local Church. I didn't have time to promote a "Downtown" effort. We fell far short of the goal of the appeal.

A struggling turnaround parish, we later needed the help of the archdiocese for some emergency, life safety capital needs. The Archdiocese of Chicago, "Downtown," came through. The repairs were made with money from a grant. That grant was funded by Annual Appeal funds. It reminded me that, as Catholics in the Archdiocese of Chicago, we are in this together. I vowed to take the appeal more seriously moving forward. And I have found that we *are* in this together. Whether we are parishioners of affluent parishes in the city or suburbs, or struggling to get by in our moderate-income parishes, or really dependent on archdiocesan grants and subsidies, we are Catholics on a mission together. We need each other. The Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA) allows us to put that reality into practice.

With my newfound appreciation for the ACA, I also became aware of the rebate concept. I turned this annual experience into a mini capital campaign. With the process planned and executed by the Archdiocese's Stewardship and Development office, it became a turnkey experience. The back-office work was, and is, done for us. We just need to follow the well-researched plan. At my former parish we articulated a capital need that could be funded by ACA rebate money. That articulation motivated doubters and cynics. And we used the rebate money for the projects and told the people we were doing so.

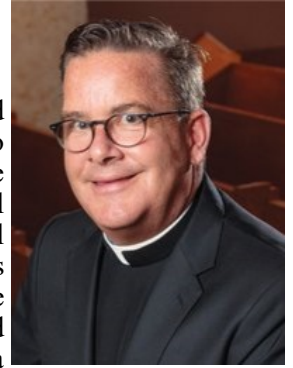
As you have read, we have a long list of deferred capital projects on both sides of town. Most pressing, it seems from the comments shared, are the surfaces of the parking lots at Saint Joseph and Saint Francis Xavier. It is the opinion of the Facilities Subcommittee of the Finance Committee that these lots should be resurfaced in this calendar year. I hope to use the rebate from the Annual Catholic Appeal to help fund this important project. **Our parish goal is \$154,000**, which is 7% of the ordinary income (Sunday and Holy Day collections) of Saints Joseph and Francis Xavier in the past fiscal year. Last year we surpassed our respective goals and collected a combined \$187,000. We used, and are using, the rebates to help fund some urgent capital needs.

Finally, as missionary disciples, we are called to remember the people on the fringes. The ACA's contribution to Catholic Relief Services connects our local parishes and the Archdiocese of Chicago to people and places around the globe who most need our help. That inspires me to give personally and to encourage you to join me.

With the Annual Catholic Appeal, we can support our struggling parishes, we can complete special unfunded local projects, and we can participate in the missionary life of the Church. The ACA is for me a vehicle to live my baptismal call, supporting the parish needs here at SSJFX and staying connected to our local and Universal Church. I hope you will join me in contributing to and supporting the Annual Catholic Appeal. Please share.

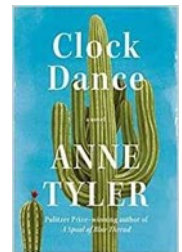

MINISTRY OF CARE

Your spiritual needs are very important to the staff at Ss. Joseph and Francis Xavier. To insure that you receive the desired spiritual care if you are hospitalized or homebound with illness, please assist us by providing us with the following.

Hospital:

If you would like anointing prior to a scheduled surgery, please call the parish office to schedule an anointing with a priest. You may also receive anointing at the hospital when there is an emergency.

When you are admitted to the hospital it is critical that you or a loved one identifies your religious affiliation, your parish name and your desire for pastoral care and communion visits.

The patient may also call the Ministry of Care line to request communion at the hospital. A Minister of Care will make sure the hospital is informed of this request.

Homebound:
