
Our Mission:

Saints JFX Parish has a new, cohesive look!



Under the leadership of Fr. Wayne and Fr. Matt, a group of parishioners from both churches worked with graphic designer and parishioner Eileen Noren to create a new logo that represents a united parish rooted in strong traditions. The group collaborated closely to develop a contemporary monogram that respects the unique histories of the two previous parishes.

The new green and gold logo was inspired by elements from the existing logos of St. Joseph and St. Francis Xavier Schools. These elements



are combined with an allusion to the Chi Rho symbol - an ancient Christogram depicting the first two letters of the Greek word for Christ.

Wayne's World

Dear Friends,

As a Roman Catholic Church, we have much to celebrate today. On this Second Sunday of Easter, we still rejoice over the Resurrection of the Lord – His victory over sin and death. This whole week was a grand victory party. There really is reason to rejoice, sing, and praise the Lord, because His victory is our victory; His cross and resurrection are our joy!

In 2000, when Pope John Paul II canonized Sister Faustina, he declared that the Second Sunday of Easter would be known as Divine Mercy Sunday. So, we celebrate Divine Mercy today, too. During his homily, Saint John Paul II also made it clear that the Image of The Divine Mercy that St. Faustina saw, which is to be venerated on Divine Mercy Sunday, represents the Risen Christ bringing mercy to the world. Pope John Paul II said: "Jesus shows His hands and His side [to the Apostles]. He points, that is, to the wounds of the Passion, especially the wound in His Heart, the source from which flows the great wave of mercy poured out on humanity."

Over eighty years ago, Sister Faustina experienced visions of the Risen Lord. As He appeared to her, He encouraged her to invite others to trust in His mercy. One night she heard an "inner-voice" that offered her a way of praying for Divine Mercy, using the beads of her Rosary. It has become known as the Chaplet of Divine Mercy. Many people find it helpful in their spiritual journey. I share the formula here. It might help you during this uncertain time.

1. Begin with the Sign of the Cross, 1 Our Father, 1 Hail Mary and The Apostles' Creed.

2. Then on the Our Father Beads say the following: *Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.*

3. On the 10 Hail Mary Beads say the following: *For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.* (*Repeat step 2 and 3 for all five decades*).

4. Conclude with (three times): Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

Throughout his pontificate, Pope Francis has directed the faithful to reflect on the love and mercy of God. Today's, "Feast of Mercy" reminds all of us that God's mercy can overcome sin, death and even this extremely challenging time. Pope Francis has said that God never tires of forgiving us. The problem is that we tire of asking God for forgiveness. On this Divine Mercy Sunday, this Second Sunday of Easter, as we listen to gentle Jesus in His encounter with Thomas and the other disciples, we can reflect on not only our own lack of faith, especially during this uncertain time – but really on the love and mercy of God in Jesus, which conquers all.




I continue to be awestruck at the outpouring of love I experience in

this community. As Easter is a fifty-day time of rejoicing, I rejoice in Divine Mercy and I rejoice in the goodness I see around Wilmette. On Easter Sunday, led by the Police and Fire Departments of our great town, a parade of cars streamed down Ashland, the passengers honking and waving to one of our own, young "Brier the Brave." Brier entered the hospital the next day for a long stay and an important medical procedure. Over 100 cars passed by, filled with children and adults pledging love, prayers and support to Brier and her family. Love and mercy, mercy and love. Jesus shows us the love of the Father. We try to live it here in Wilmette.

As we revel in our God's mercy, let's live that mercy in whatever ways we can!

Reflections from two of our five RCIA Candidates:



Vaughn C. (Chuck) Leath

I was born in Oakland, California, in 1941. I grew up in Northern California and went to college at San Jose State University in the 1960's. Over the years I've worked for a number of companies including Merrill Lynch and Wm. Blair as a Financial Advisor/Stockbroker and HSBC as a residential mortgage underwriter, and also a few years of being in business with my brother making fiberglass products such as small boats and laundry baskets for commercial laundries.

I married my wife, Denise Gerbi, in 1976 in Chicago. She had moved here from Erie, PA, to complete her Masters at Loyola University. This year we will have been married 44 years. We had two wonderful boys, John and David, who, tragically, preceded us in death.

Denise has been a member of St Joseph's for the 41 years we have lived in Wilmette. Both our boys attended Religious Education classes and were confirmed into the Church. I grew up going to Sunday school and church as a Presbyterian, but over the years it became less important to me.

With the loss of our boys I felt a need to get more closely involved with the Church to both fill the void and to find peace. I now look forward to attending Church regularly with Denise and becoming a part of our Parish's active community.



The Journey

I was baptized and confirmed in the Episcopal church and then attended non-denominational churches as an adult. Looking back, while I learned a lot biblically, something was missing. I learned about the Eastern religions and still that did not fill the void. In the past two years, I started to explore the Catholic faith by talking to people; some who are devout and some who are not. The more I learned, Catholicism seemed to fill the part that was missing for me.

To become Catholic would mean attending RCIA classes. I wasn't thrilled with the thought as it felt like I had to "jump through hoops" that I wouldn't have to do if I went to a Protestant church. I made the decision to try RCIA classes and have to firmly say the Holy Spirit led me to the classes at St. Francis Xavier. There are way too many reasons to list why I am where I should be. Just know, I am so grateful.

Since September, I have loved Mondays. Why? That is when the RCIA class meets; it has become the best night of the week. I have loved learning about the Catholic faith from the history to the theology to the saints. Reading about the saints has shown me what true devotion in the faith means to be a follower.

It is the start of Holy Week as I write this and I will not be received into the church at Easter. When I attend mass, not being able to take the Eucharist makes it seem incomplete. As I will have to wait, it makes when the time comes all the more sacred.


