

Wayne's World

Dear Friends,

Eleven. Matthew tells us, "The eleven disciples went to Galilee to the mountain to which Jesus ordered them." I'm glad Matthew mentions the number. As he does, he reminds us that although Jesus called twelve, at this point in His ministry only eleven were left – and those eleven were far from perfect. Matthew tells us that the eleven worshipped and doubted.

The enumerating of those present for Jesus' final discourse in Matthew's Gospel points out that even among His contemporaries Jesus was a stumbling block. Not everyone could accept the call and the challenge to be a disciple. The missing Judas, not seen and barely mentioned in the Synoptic Gospels after the encounter in the Garden of Gethsemane, stands for all who choose not to follow the Lord. When I was a younger priest, sometimes frustrated at the number of people who weren't practicing their faith, Sister Mary K would remind me, "Jesus only got eleven!" Since God created us with freedom, we freely choose whether or not we want to follow Jesus. If you are reading this, I assume you join the eleven in their desire to follow. They went as He commanded them; we can do likewise.

Put yourself in the shoes (or sandals!) of the eleven for a moment. They had seen a lot. They experienced the love and power, the mercy and grace, the pain and suffering, the death and resurrection of the man they called Master and Teacher. And then He ordered them to go to some mountain at the edge of town. Talk about an emotional roller coaster! He ordered. They followed the order. But they doubted. Then Jesus approached the eleven. He gave them – and us – a reminder and a threefold message in the midst of their confused obedience.

As a reminder, Jesus asserts His earthly and heavenly power. This assertion assuages the doubts and fears of the disciples. It is as if He says, "Don't worry. I am as powerful as you think I am. Do not doubt. Do not be afraid." He meets them where they are, aware of their trepidation and lets them know of His might. With a final reminder of the strength He possesses, Jesus calms their fears and allays their doubts. As we walk through life centuries later, we should also remember the power of Christ in our lives and in our world.

After the reminder of the power come the commands. Two connected commands really comprise the first. He says baptize *and* make disciples. Sometimes I think people believe that if they baptize, that's enough. Jesus says, "Make disciples... baptizing..." So really the role of the Christian community is to foster discipleship. I cannot count the number of times I have reminded parents that they promise to raise their children in the practice of the faith. In a sense, the parents – as well as the Christian community, are called to make their children disciples!

Secondly, He says, "Teach."



We must, by our words and our deeds instruct the world on discipleship. Jesus shows us the way. By what He said, and, more importantly, what He did, Jesus taught. We too can be teachers by loving, forgiving, comforting, healing, reconciling, challenging, loving... We teach so much more by our actions than by our words. As we prepare to return to the Sacraments, maybe it is time to reconsider our commitment to them. When we can, let's commit to teaching our children the importance of regular, at least weekly, participation in the Mass.

Lastly Jesus tells us to remember. He says that we are to remember that He is with us always. At Mass we remember. But the *always* part is important. In the everyday moments of our lives, in happy times and in sad ones, Jesus is present. He is with us always, even during times of uncertainty and pandemic! Remember!

Allow me to thank the Saints JFX reopening team for the hard work put in to open the church for the Sacrament of Reconciliation this weekend. Because of the great caution our Church and civil authorities are encouraging, this reopening takes work, to ensure the safety of all. Some have chosen rather than to complain about this or that, about church or civil officials, to roll up their sleeves and make a difference. Sadly, some continue to just complain. I thank those who help.

As we reopen and prepare for a wider roll out, we will need more help. If you are over 18 and not in the vulnerable population, we would appreciate your assistance, with set up, greeting, or cleaning/ disinfecting. The ask is a safe one and only requires two to five hours a week. We don't have details about the Mass reopening, but we sense that if we want to reopen both campuses, we will need more than 100 volunteers. You will be trained, and we will ensure your safety. Let's do this together so that we can baptize, make disciples, teach and remember.
