

Happy Father's Day to all the fathers, grandfathers, and father figures in our community! I know I said it last week, but today's the real day and I am grateful for the fathers who pass on a spirit of faith and service to their children, as mine did so well.

Some of you know that I relate to Father Solanus Casey. He was a Capuchin priest who loved people, especially the poor and the sick. He is on the path to sainthood; when I say I relate well to him it is because of the former, not the latter! I also relate to him in the sense that I turn to him for guidance and intercession.

One of his great, wise and often quoted sayings, which I am sure I have shared with you before, is "Worry is a weakness from which very few of us are entirely free. We must be on guard against this most insidious enemy of our peace of soul. Instead let us foster confidence in God and thank Him ahead of time for whatever he chooses to send us." I think this quote is based on real faith in a provident God, who knows us, loves us and always, always cares for us. Even within his own difficult spiritual journey, he experienced God's gift and God's love, and shared that gift and love with the world.

Jeremiah, in this weekend's scripture reading, describes a situation not too different than our own. "Terror on every side!" It seems like that describes much of the last three months. Who would have imagined fifty weeks ago when we became one parish that we would be working as one through the terrors of a pandemic? Who would have thought that racism, and the protests, riots and looting, would haver brought our city and state to a standstill, with imposed curfews the City of Chicago hasn't seen since the 1960s? Who would have thought that the stability of our financial structures and comfort would have come crashing down because of a virus? Thinking about it all, life can seem terrible.

In the midst of the terror on every side, Jeremiah expresses confidence, "But the LORD is with me, like a mighty champion: my persecutors will stumble, they will not triumph." And, "Sing to the LORD, praise the LORD, for he has rescued the life of the poor from the power of the wicked!" It serves us well to remember that God is with us, that God cares for us, and that God has power over all these forces that seem to be killing the body and the spirit.

In case we forget the faithfulness of our God, Jesus reminds us in today's Gospel. Jesus reminds us to not be afraid of those who can kill the body but cannot kill the soul. He reminds us of the value we have in the Father's eyes. He tells us of the intimacy with which God



knows us. God even knows the number of hairs on our heads. He loves us, is with us and is concerned over us.

Certainly, transgressions occur. We have seen hundreds of them over these last weeks of unrest. We have seen unjust killings, we have seen racism, violence and damage to property of innocent property owners. But we have been given a great gift, as Saint Paul reminds us in our second reading. We have received the grace of God and the gift of the one man, Jesus Christ, whose love overflows for the many. He came, lived, taught, healed, forgave, suffered, died, rose, and ascended to the Father. This mission was a gift of God's love for the human race. And before he died, he gave us his Body and Blood.

We have the opportunity to receive his Body and Blood – daily, now that we are reopened! When we receive his Body and Blood we are emboldened and strengthened to not worry, to thank God ahead of time for whatever he chooses to send us, and to acknowledge Jesus, whether it is convenient or inconvenient, by our words and by our deeds.

I thank you again for your patience and for your help during the reopening process. Slowly but surely, we are getting accustomed to the new normal. I continue to seek donors to help with the deferred, urgent capital projects. The "must do" projects for the summer that still need funding are the parking lot resurfacing at both campuses and the urgent masonry repairs to Saint Francis Xavier Church.
