Unity Update

Dear Friends,

It's been ten weeks since we became one parish and I gratefully took the helm of this ship we call Saints Joseph and Francis Xavier. In six weeks, I will be officially installed as the pastor of this great parish.

Over the past ten weeks, we, and when I say "we" I mean scores of dedicated volunteer leaders, have begun the investigation process. We are examining finances and merging parish operating accounts. We are convening the parish council and the school board. The finance and facilities committees are working overtime. The women's club is expanding and welcoming many new members. Party planners are organizing some promising events. The Rosary crew is enthusiastically promoting the month of the Rosary when we will gather at Saint Joseph Church each night of October at 7 pm to petition Our Lady's intercession in our unification efforts.

The school began with over six hundred students across both Saints Joseph and Francis Xavier campuses. Colleen Barrett and her team worked throughout the summer to ensure that the transition would be as smooth as possible. Our Religious Education programs also have over 600 students.

We have noticed some urgent capital needs to be addressed and have found generous donors to help fund their respective projects. If you haven't seen them yet, soon you will see some changes around both parish campuses.

On the Saint Francis Xavier campus...

Finishing touches on the new school building.

Touch ups in the church: We have fixed chipped paint and repainted the handrails in the sanctuary.

Carpet. We have a team assembled, including Father Harnett, who orchestrated the installation of the current carpeting when he was pastor. This team will vet the vendors and choose the new carpet for the church (paid for by a generous donation). Hopefully by Advent we will be walking on the new carpet in our beautiful church.

Exterior surface replacement. We have received bids (and another donation) to replace the bluestone outside of the church. Archdiocesan facilities people have pointed out that the surface is a dangerous trip hazard. If will be replaced before the weather changes.

Lighting. Many have commented that the bulbs in the church are not shedding the light that they used to. We've consulted a lighting expert who is examining the bulbs and making a proposal to brighten the church.

On the Saint Joseph campus...

Roof. After many starts and restarts, the annex roof will be completed this week. The condition of the roof was far worse than we expected. But by the time you read this, most of the roof will be finished.

Interior repairs. Once the roof Is fixed and we are promised that the water infiltration has ended, we will repair the water-damaged hallways of the annex. This is something I have wanted to do since January.

Lighting. We are finishing the much-awaited lighting project. The sconces for the lights for the Stations are in the final stages of construction by one of our parishioners. Once the box sconces are prepared, we will install and program the lights on the Stations, the sanctuary and the stained glass windows on the north and south sides of the church.

Sound. The new speaker and hearing loop (paid by a donor) have been ordered by the contractor. A meeting is planned this week between the electrician and the sound people to schedule the stages of installation. Likely the new system will be installed by the middle of October, if not sooner.

Masonry. The final stage of the masonry project on the school building is finished. Now that the building is watertight, we will repair the water damage on the second floor of the school building. I believe our insurance will cover the water damage repair.

Interior painting. To prepare to welcome the little ones at Lake and Ridge, we repainted the whole first floor of the school building.

In summary...

Capital needs will soon be articulated along with some ballpark price estimates for each. At first look, it's apparent that there will be many projects with various levels of urgency on the articulated cross-campus list. Perhaps you would like to underwrite one of the many projects. Once we have the list and estimates, I will publish them and seek your generosity to make sure our two campuses will remain strong, safe and beautiful for years to come. Some of the wish list projects are sure to have hefty price tags, but I have no doubt that you will respond to the call to generosity - as you have so many times throughout our great history.

Our Cross Functional Transition Team will wind up its important mission and the baton will be handed on to a long-range planning committee that will thoughtfully examine the use of our facilities in the education of the young people who give our parish so much life. I thank the members of the Cross Functional Transition Team for their guidance, thoughtfulness, prayerfulness and enthusiasm. That team accomplished much in a short time. I ask your prayers for and patience with the School Long Range Planning Team as we begin to really look at the best ways to utilize both campuses in the short- and long-term future. We will do our best to listen to our stakeholders and ultimately do what's best for the children entrusted to our care.

When we "walk together" in our efforts, we accomplish great things!

Heard at the SFX 9:30am communion and sung by the Magdalene Choir is *Without Seeing You* by contemporary Catholic composer David Haas. This piece is inspired by 1 Peter 1:8:

"Though you have not seen him, you love him; and even though you do not see him now, you believe in him and are filled with an inexpressible and glorious joy."

Heard at the onset of the SFX 11:30am communion is My Good Lord's Done Been Here and is sung by Artega Wright. This traditional spiritual is arranged by Moses Hogan (b.1957-2003). Hogan was an internationally celebrated composer, pianist, and conductor who is best known for his spiritual arrangements.

Additionally heard at the 11:30am communion and sung by the SFX Adult Choir is O come, ye servants of the Lord by Christopher Tye (b.1505-1573). Tye was an English Renaissance composer, organist, and the music instructor of Edward VI. Tye bridged the mid-16th-century change of musical style during the English Reformation. Today's anthem includes text in Latin and in English:

O come, ye servants of the Lord, and praise His holy name From early morn to setting sun, His might on earth proclaim. His laws are just, and glad the heart: He makes His mercies known. Ye princes come, ye people too, and bow before His throne.

This weekend St. Joseph church says a fond farewell and offers best wishes to one of our longest serving cantors and song leaders. <u>Suzanne Santos</u> has been leading us in worship for nearly 12 years, and in the recent couple of years, she has often been joined by her amazingly talented children, Bernadette and Benedict.
