The communion anthem heard at the 9:30am SFX Mass as sung by the Magdalene Choir is *There Are Many Rooms* by Liam Lawton. Born in Ireland, Lawton is an award winning singer-songwriter and Catholic Priest. *There Are Many Rooms* was composed in 2009 with text based on John 14.

As we celebrate All Saints' Day weekend, the St. Joseph adult choir will sing a wonderful composition by Darlene Zschech called *The Potter's Hand*. "You gently call me into your presence, guiding me by your Holy Spirit. Teach me, O Lord, to live all of my life through Your eyes." With the Advent season just a month away, these words can be a mantra for us as we place our lives in the Potter's hand.

The choral motet heard at the 11:30am SFX communion is *Locus iste* by Austrian composer Anton Bruckner (b.1824-1896). Bruckner composed this work in 1869 for the dedication of the votive chapel at the New Cathedral in Linz, Austria, where he had been the cathedral organist. Below is a translation:

Father Charles Rubey, Founder and Director of the LOSS program of Catholic Charities, and our parish's own Miggie McCurry, a suicide survivor, will address the painful issues of living after a loved one's death from suicide. Mig's brother, John, died 12 years ago. Living with the every day realities of life, holidays, anniversaries, and special memories presents many emotions and challenges. Fr. Rubey says "No one is ever the same after this experience. Ever." The impact, the emotions, and the misconceptions of how suicide affects survivors will be discussed. "What do I say? What do I do? How can I support someone with this loss?" It's complicated.

Father Rubey and Miggie are social workers by profession and hold an educated perspective as well regarding suicide. Join us for this enlightening conversation about this difficult but very real topic that touches so many lives.
