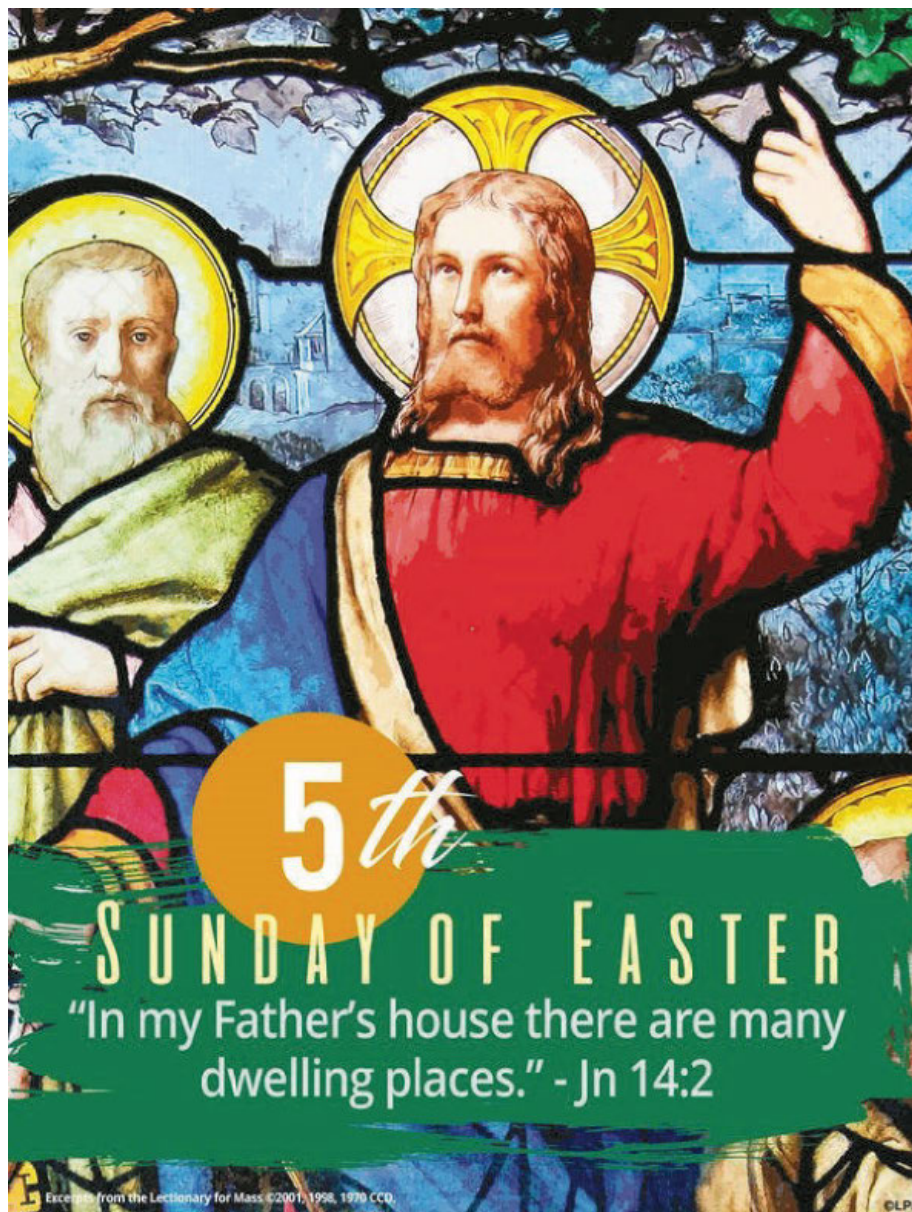

Dear Friends,
Do not let your hearts be troubled.
Believe.
Do the works that I have done.

This threefold command given to the disciples, who really didn't get it, is given to us today. Everything that is happening in our Church and in our world may tempt us to worry or despair. Jesus says do not. He calls us to have faith in God and faith in him. Putting this into practice takes discipline. When we say we trust, or believe, or have faith in God, we need to really allow God to lead us, to guide our lives. We belong to God. He made us. He gives us what we need. Truly, we are nothing without him.

Today's Gospel is often proclaimed at funeral Masses. The Spanish translation of the first sentence is striking. "No pierdan la paz." "Do not lose peace." Jesus, repeatedly, in the post-resurrection accounts in the Gospels offers peace to his disciples – his peace. As modern-day disciples, we must live in the peace of Christ and not lose peace. We must become peacemakers by the way we live our lives.

As you listen to the words of Jesus today, you might want to ask yourself what it is that causes your peace, or really the peace of Jesus in you, to be shaken. Family relationships, employment or financial issues, world events, gossip, and uncertainty about the future can shake our peace. For us to not be troubled, Jesus gives us the solution, "have faith in God and faith in me." When we begin to lose the peace, we need to remind ourselves to believe. We need to believe in the power of God and in God's unconditional love for us. We need to believe that we indeed are beloved children of God. And we need to believe that with Christ all shall be well, and all things are possible. Do you believe?

Believing is a great way to maintain peace. It is, though, just a start. To Thomas, who said, "We do not know where you are going, how can we know the way," to Phillip who demanded to see the Father, and to the rest of his disciples - and to us, Jesus says, "The one who believes in me will do the works I do." As believers, we must continue the mission of Jesus Christ. We must live his love and share his mercy with the world. As believers we must do the work he does. Think about it. Think of all the wonderful ways Jesus did the will of the Father while he walked this earth. Then think about the ways you can continue the work in your own life. That is the life of the Church. That is the life of the Christian.



Listen again to the words of Saint Peter, "You are "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people of his own, so that you may announce the praises" of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light." So don't be troubled; believe, do the works of the Lord, and live in the wonderful light of Christ. A great Easter reminder in this wonderful season.

Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese of Chicago does the works of the Lord and lives the Corporal Works of Mercy. It's fitting that we will take our second collection on Mothers' Day for Catholic Charities. With the state of our society, the Archdiocese of Chicago must rally now more than ever around its biggest social service arm. Catholic Charities depends mightily on the generosity of the people in the pews to continue its mission, one that has been tirelessly kept for over a hundred years. I thank Katie and Marty Bredemann and Anne Kelly Williams for speaking at the Masses this weekend and sharing their passion for the work we do at Catholic Charities. I implore your generosity next week. I promise my own.

From the Loft

In our weekend Gospels during the Easter season, we have heard stories about Jesus appearing, unrecognized, in the midst of his followers. Then, during the meal, he blesses and breaks the bread, and suddenly their eyes are opened.

Our choir anthem this week at St. Joseph tells this story in song, "Be Known To Us In Breaking Bread" The anthem is a quiet and prayerful rendition by Jay Althouse. We hope you find it meditative and beautiful.

Sunday Masses at SFX during the Easter season have incorporated the sacred music of Mozart. Each Sunday, we've heard a different sacred aria from the exuberant and florid Alleluja from *Exsultate, jubilate*, K. 165 to the lyrical masterpiece, Laudate Dominum from *Vesperae solmnes de confessore*, K. 339. This Sunday, we hear a beautiful and rare minor key aria from Mozart's setting of the Eastertide Marian antiphon *Regina caeli*, K. 108. Composed in 1771 after an extended journey to Naples, the then 15-year-old Mozart exemplifies the Neapolitan church music style of the time. Thank our fantastic parish musicians, Elizabeth Fisher, Michelle Ford, and Yuiry Geyer for breathing their artistry into this musically challenging repertoire.

There is one more month in the current choir season. If you've considered joining, now is the time to try it out. This week we rehearse at 9:30am in the Community Room; next week we rehearse in the SFX choir loft at 8:30am. We hope to see you there.



Congratulations to the children of our parish who will receive their first Holy Communion over the next several weekends. Please keep them in your prayers.

INSTITUTE FOR DIACONAL STUDIES

Congratulations to Christopher Keefe. On May 13th, Cardinal Blase Cupich will ordain him to the Order of Deacon at Holy Name Cathedral in Chicago. He will be one of 25 men to be ordained as deacons.

Christopher Keefe has journeyed through four years of preparation for this day, attending academic classes, formation programs, engaging in extensive theological reflection sessions, retreats, regular spiritual direction, as well as being involved in many liturgical practica and pastoral field education experiences, including an eleven-month internship.

Ordinations to the (permanent) Diaconate in the Archdiocese of Chicago have taken place since 1972. There are presently more than 500 active deacons in the Archdiocese, as well as nearly 30 men currently in formation, with a new cohort beginning in the fall. The presence of deacons serving in the Archdiocese is widespread, yet still a frequently asked question is, "What or who is a deacon?"

Bishops, priests and deacons receive the Sacrament of Holy Orders. The diaconate is a three-fold ministry of Word, Liturgy and Charity that is in service to the bishop. Deacons are ordained to baptize, proclaim the Gospel and preach, assist at the Eucharist, witness marriages, officiate at wakes and funeral services, etc. These are the ministries most visible in the parish. The less visible aspect of diaconal ministry traditionally has its history in the Acts of the Apostles, chapter 6. The Apostles laid hands on "...seven reputable men, filled with the Holy Spirit and wisdom..." to care for the widows and administer the daily distribution in the early Christian community.

Thus, from the earliest days of the Church, deacons were involved in service to the bishop not only liturgically and through evangelization efforts but as administrators and representatives (the bishop's "eyes and ears"), charged with caring for the poor (spiritually, emotionally, physically), the alienated, and those who, for various reasons, find themselves on the fringes of society. Therefore, deacons also minister in hospitals, prisons, shelters, soup kitchens, and within the various ministries coordinated through organizations such as Catholic Charities and the St. Vincent de Paul Society, modeling the call of *diakonia* that belongs to all the baptized in service to our brothers and sisters in Christ.

And since most deacons work full-time outside the Church, deacons in their workplace (and in the world) are sacramental signs and icons of Christ the Servant visible in the community.

Please keep in your prayers Christopher Keefe, all candidates who will be ordained, their wives and families, and all those in formation, that they might continue to answer God's call in their lives.

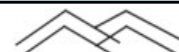
