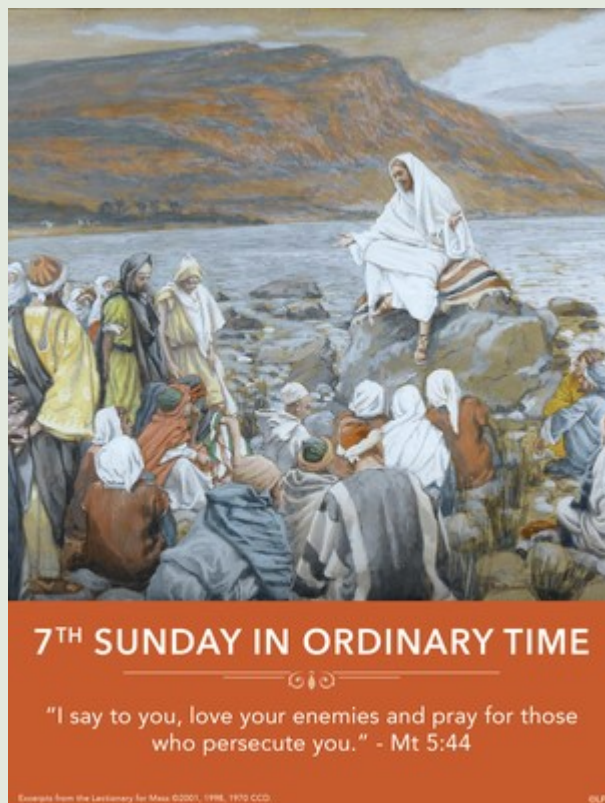

Dear Friends,

You are the temple of God! What a great reminder Saint Paul gives us as we continue these difficult winter days. When we consider God's temple, we think of super holy places. While I have few solo pictures of myself displayed in my room, I do treasure one that I see each morning as I begin my day. This photo portrays me vested for Mass at the altar in the choir section of Notre Dame Cathedral in Paris. I had the honor of celebrating Holy Mass there on one of my Lourdes trips.

The image strikes the viewer because the person in the photo is really not the subject; it highlights the smallness of the individual in comparison to the space. Notre Dame Cathedral symbolizes the French Church; it stands in the center of the city, and has stood for centuries as a place of pilgrimage, prayer and awe. It certainly is a holy place. When the tragic fire occurred last April 15th, the whole world watched with great sadness. People were sad because they knew that when they entered that cathedral, they encountered the holy. Temples of God come in all makes and sizes, just as literal churches do. Their common characteristic: holiness.

Saint Paul tells us that you and I are the temples of God, too. We likely won't stand for centuries, and we won't necessarily draw people from over the globe. We are minute in comparison to the centuries old structure. But we're called to be temples. When people encounter us, do they encounter something holy? What is this holiness to which we are called? How can we be temples of the Lord?

I once had the opportunity in late 1990 to meet and celebrate Mass with Blessed John Paul II. A very young priest, eager to see the private chapel of the Holy Father, I vested quickly after the guards permitted us to enter the papal apartment, and bounded into the chapel. I distinctly remember being stopped in my tracks when I caught sight of him. There he was, the seventy-year-old pontiff of the Roman Catholic Church, kneeling in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. I quickly and quietly took my place a few feet from him where I was assigned. I watched him and witnessed an intensity of prayer that I had seen in no other. I sat in the presence of a temple of God. His prayer inspired me to pray more. **Holy people pray.**

Throughout salvation history, God calls His people to the holiness of life. He commands Moses to speak to his people, "Be holy, for, I the Lord your God, am holy." He then gives some specifics to Moses, ultimately reminding Moses, his people, and us, of the importance of love. **Holy people commit to unconditional love.**

Think of the holy people you know. What makes them holy? Two other characteristics stand out to me: **surrender to the will of God**, and **self-gift**. In order for us to be temples of God, we need to let go of our willfulness and adopt willingness. When we pray the Lord's Prayer, we pray that God's will be done. Saint Paul reminds us that, above all, we belong to Christ and Christ to God. We must allow Him to possess us, surrendering all that we are to Christ, who surrendered all that He is to God.



Realizing that all we are and have and will be belongs to God, we need to give that back to God. There are givers and takers in the world. Temples of God, God's holy ones, are **givers**. Giving of self without counting the cost, leads to holiness. When we are empty, God fills us.

That leads me to a few words about the Annual Catholic Appeal. I invite and encourage you to make a generous pledge, to actually pledge more than you think you can afford. God will provide the rest. Our Wilmette Catholic community has been very successful the last several years, giving to the mission of the archdiocese and getting great returns here. Every cent over goal will come back to Saints Joseph and Francis Xavier and will allow us to continue making the improvements so needed here. Last year's appeal returned almost forty-two thousand dollars to us. We will use that money, combined with generous parishioners' donations, to improve our facilities.

As holy temples of God, I encourage you to pray, surrender, give and love. Your substantial gift will make a difference – in the Church and in you!



Reflection on our Parish unification

Change can be difficult, but it can also help us to grow. Working together with the support of longtime and new friends, great things can happen. We have been parishioners for 34 years and believe that great things are happening with the unification of the Wilmette parishes.

In November 2018, the St. Joseph Women’s Club began inviting women of St. Francis Xavier to attend events and become club members. Upon the unification of the two parishes, the club was renamed the SSJFX Women’s Club. Together, members make prayer blankets for the ill, provide assistance to parishioners in need of help, deliver Meals on Wheels, and volunteer at Sacred Heart Convent, Misericordia and Catholic Charities. They also pray together, work to support our parish, and enjoy getting to know each other as friends. In December, over 70 women gathered at SFX gym for the Women’s Club annual Christmas dinner. On February 8, members, their guests, and women of the parish enjoyed a Valentine’s Tea at Sunset Ridge Country Club. Coming together has truly been a fun thing to do!

As members of the Bereavement Ministry, we assist with parish funerals. Under the direction of Kieran Lyons, the ministry has expanded to cover funerals at both churches. Kieran is also overseeing the Ministers of Care, who deliver communion to the homebound. Both ministries are now benefitting from her oversight and the breadth and variety of our members’ experiences.

At the Unification Mass in June, the combined parish choir sang beautifully together, and continues to do so on a monthly basis. In December, parishioners from each campus sang together in an annual Christmas caroling event.

Volunteer opportunities have grown as we have united. George has enjoyed tutoring English as a second language to students at St. Thomas of Canterbury School in Chicago, a program SFX has embraced for many years. SFX volunteers have been helping when SJ hosts Family Promise, a program to which SJ has been committed for quite some time.

We love that many of the neighbors, friends and acquaintances we have come to know over the years have now become our fellow parishioners. We have also made new friends, which feels fantastic. For this we are thankful.



MINISTRY OF CARE

Your spiritual needs are very important to the staff at Ss. Joseph and Francis Xavier. To insure that you receive the desired spiritual care if you are hospitalized or homebound with illness, please assist us by providing us with the following.

Hospital:

If you would like anointing prior to a scheduled surgery, please call the parish office to schedule an anointing with a priest. You may also receive anointing at the hospital when there is an emergency.

When you are admitted to the hospital it is critical that you or a loved one identifies your religious affiliation, your parish name and your desire for pastoral care and communion visits.

The patient may also call the Ministry of Care line to request communion at the hospital. A Minister of Care will make sure the hospital is informed of this request.

Homebound:

Trained Ministers of Care are available to bring communion to our parish sick and homebound. Ministers also visit local assisted living and nursing care homes. To schedule a visit, please call the Ministry of Care line at: 847 256-2273 press 0 and a Minister of Care will return your call.
