

# Wayne's World

Dear Friends,

Today, as we continue our Lenten journey just two weeks from the celebration of the Paschal Mystery, we see the real humanity and true divinity of the one whose passion and death we will remember and whose resurrection from the dead we will celebrate, albeit in a uniquely different way this year, in two weeks. Jesus, fully God and a fully human man, one with deep feelings and true friendships, loved Martha, Mary and Lazarus. So, moved by the death of His dear friend, He wept.

As if through His tears and sorrow, Jesus remembered who He was and why He was sent into this world. God sent Jesus into the world to reconcile the world to Himself and to bring life and light. Jesus, the Son of God *is* "consubstantial" with the Father. Fully God, Jesus, with divine power and authority called the dead Lazarus to come out of the tomb. "Untie him," Jesus said, "And let him go." His divine power prevailed then and prevails now, even as we experience our third Sunday apart from one another due to this Covid-19 crisis.

"With the Lord there is mercy and the fullness of redemption." We need the Psalmist's words now more than ever. We need the hope that Jesus' suffering and death offers us. We need to experience His life-saving power. We need to do what so many, in His day and in ours, do not; we need to believe.

What is necessary for us to allow Jesus' power to work, in our individual lives and in our common life? First and foremost we need to acknowledge some things about ourselves, and recognize what God does. We must admit that at times our hearts are stony and hardened, and that because of sin, part of us has died. God promises to bring us back to life. He tells us that He will bring us up from the death of sin to the life of mercy and union with God. God promises to send His Spirit into our hearts. What a promise!

When I was in the seminary, one of my professors, now the Archbishop of Milwaukee, insisted that in order to pass his practicum class, all candidates must memorize the words of absolution spoken by the priest in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. He thought it was important to have the words in our hearts so that when we prayed them with the penitent we could engage the person and help them to fully understand the message they carried. I still have them in my heart today. I love to pray them as the confessor and I love to hear them as the penitent. In a sense, these words epitomize God's love for us and bring us the life and mercy the Sacrament offers. If you haven't heard them recently, I share them here.

Last Saturday, before I even knew about the upcoming suspension, I had the opportunity to avail myself of the Sacrament. The experience of hearing the priest's words, after I expressed sorrow for my own sins and a desire to change almost moved me to tears. Perhaps the Archdiocese's new emergency guidelines suspending individual Sacramental Reconciliation might make us think about our own appreciation of the Sacrament. I received these guidelines Monday.

Given that our churches are closed and a stay-at-home order is in effect:



- individual confessions are currently not possible; this includes virtual or phone confessions, which are never permissible, nor drive-thru confessions. Despite the good intentions around such novelty, we must attend to our underlying theological tradition of the sacrament, as well as support the stay-at-home order and its intended purpose – to keep people safe in their homes at this time.
- in keeping with longstanding pastoral practice when penitents' access to the sacrament is restricted, they can be assured that their sins are forgiven if they make an act of contrition with a firm resolve to approach the Sacrament of Reconciliation after the stay-at-home order is lifted.
- the faithful should be encouraged to pray, seeking the mercy and forgiveness of God and the grace of reconciliation.

I invite you to pray over these powerful words and prompt you to avail yourself of the Sacrament of Reconciliation whenever this suspension is lifted.

"God, the Father of mercies, through the death and resurrection of his Son has reconciled the world to himself and sent the Holy Spirit among us for the forgiveness of sins; through the ministry of the Church may God give you pardon and peace, and I absolve you from your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and the Holy Spirit."
