

Dear Friends,

Welcome to the Palm Sunday celebration which is the joyful entry of Jesus into Jerusalem just a week before His crucifixion and death. This celebration became possible because of one word, "love," which is the unconditional love for His creation. There are four types of love coming from the Greek language and culture. The first one is "Eros" the sensual love between human beings which is self-gratifying. The second kind of love is called "storge" which refers to natural or instinctual affection, such as the love of parents towards their offspring and vice versa. The third one is called "Philia" which is the type of love that all Christians are called to practice towards each other. "Love one another with brotherly affection, outdo one another in showing honor" (Romans 12:10).

Finally, we have the ultimate kind of love, "agape," which is the selfless love, the unconditional love, the sacrificial love which is the love of God for you and me to the point that He took flesh through the incarnation of Jesus to redeem and save us. The incarnation of Jesus was a manifestation of love beyond understanding. "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16). He loves us so much He became human so that we could become divine through the ultimate sacrifice of the cross for our redemption and salvation.

Underneath the joy of this celebration, lay different layers of sorrows because we know what happened to Jesus on Good Friday. That's why the Passion is being proclaimed today to remind us of the dichotomy of today's celebration. This Sunday we sing "Hosanna in the highest, blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, hosanna in the highest," and this coming Friday we will sing "Were you there when they crucified my Lord; were you there when they laid him in the tomb?" Today, we commemorate not only His solemn entry into Jerusalem but also the sorrows of Jesus being arrested, the sorrows of His journey from the garden of Gethsemane to Golgotha, and also the sorrow of the crucifixion. In Haiti, we have a proverb that goes like this: "Après la pluie c'est le beau temps" which means after every sorrow, every difficult situation, comes the joyful moment because the sorrows and life tribulations are not forever. All sorrows and pain came to pass at the moment Jesus breathed His last breath, and three days

after He experienced the most joyous moments of His earthly mission that Easter Sunday. It was a mission well accomplished.

We, as Christians, at the moment of our baptism have embarked on the same journey to Jerusalem. We said yes to selfless life and selfless love. We have



promised to empty ourselves to be the beacon of God's unconditional love in this world; at our baptism, we said yes to become priest, prophet and king and finally, we said yes to journey with Jesus to Jerusalem and carry our cross all the way to Golgotha and of course experience the joy of the resurrection with Him. Saint Paul says in Romans 6:4, "We were therefore buried with Him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life."

During Holy Week, let us be mindful of the brotherly love and affections that unite us into one community of believers sustained and nourished by the body of Christ.


