My name is Dana McKenna, and I am the Director of Religious Education at the St. Joseph campus. I have always loved the beauty of sacramentals and traditions of our church, and I have tried to generate the same interest and love for them in the students and their families during my years working for the church.

One of my favorite traditions is the blessing of homes and households on The Feast of the Epiphany which we are celebrating this weekend, also known as the Twelfth Day of Christmas or Three Kings Day. The traditional date of Epiphany is January 6<sup>th</sup>, but in the United States it is celebrated on the Sunday between January 2<sup>nd</sup> and January 8<sup>th</sup>. This is a centuries-old tradition. In the past, priests would visit each home in their parish after the Feast of the Epiphany. However, over time this became more difficult to accomplish, so the accepted tradition became that a member of the household is able to lead this blessing in place of the priest.

The blessing that is said has deep biblical roots, tied to the Passover in the book of Exodus. The blessing takes place during the “chalking” of the doors. At this time, the following is inscribed over the entrance to your home - or the lintel: 20 + C + M + B + 20. The formula varies every year. The letters have two meanings. First, they represent the initials of the Magi: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar. The “+” between each letter represents the cross, and the 20 at the beginning and at the end represent the year. Taken together, this inscription is performed as a request for Christ to bless these homes so marked and that He stay with those who dwell there throughout the entire year. This Christian custom of “chalking” the door has a biblical precedent as the Israelites in the Old Testament marked their doors in order to be saved from death; so, too, the practice of chalking the doors at Epiphany serves to protect Christian homes from evil spirits until the following year when the new inscription is written.

A few of the other traditions that are very meaningful to me are:

- \* The blessing of the Infant Jesus figures for each family’s Nativity scene (the third Sunday of Advent),
- \* Feast of St. Blase (February 3<sup>rd</sup>)
- \* Joseph Table (March 19<sup>th</sup>)
- \* May Crowning on Mother’s Day
- \* Animal Blessing near the feast of St. Francis of Assisi (October 4<sup>th</sup>).

In keeping with the spirit of giving, this weekend the fifth graders in the Religious Education class will participate in the 10:30 Mass for Epiphany Sunday. During the offertory collection they will collect boxes of cereal to be donated to St. Ignatius Church in Rogers Park. Cereal boxes will also be collected during Religious Education classes or can be left at the entrances of church.


In addition to collecting cereal, as you leave Mass today, please remember to pick up an Epiphany blessing bag at the exits of church, so you, too, can start the tradition of the Epiphany Blessing with your family.

My hope is that this has inspired you to think of some of the Catholic traditions you enjoy and share with your family.

- There's an "Ushers' Cut" from the weekly collection. (Hogwash)

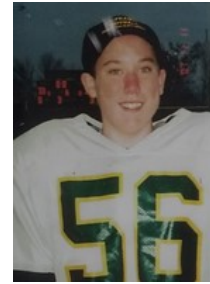

## MINISTRY OF CARE

**Your spiritual needs are very important to the staff at Ss. Joseph and Francis Xavier.** To insure that you receive the desired spiritual care if you are hospitalized or homebound with illness, please assist us by providing us with the following.

### Hospital:

If you would like anointing prior to a scheduled surgery, please call the parish office to schedule an anointing with a priest. You may also receive anointing at the hospital when there is an emergency.

When you are admitted to the hospital it is critical that you or a loved one identifies your religious affiliation, your parish name and your desire for pastoral care and communion visits.

The patient may also call the Ministry of Care line to request communion at the hospital. A Minister of Care will make sure the hospital is informed of this request.
