2020 Scholarships Announced**

The Women's Club will give three scholarships this spring to eighth-grade students in Saints Joseph and Francis Xavier Parish. Students must be planning to attend a Catholic high school in the fall of 2020. A \$1,500 scholarship will be awarded to the winner and two \$1,000 scholarships to the runners-up. Winners will be announced in April.

Scholarship criteria include a student's desire for furthering his or her Catholic education, academic achievement, school/community involvement, and the submission of a 300-350 word essay on an assigned topic. Applications will be made available in early February to all eighth-grade students in the parish.

Completed essays and applications are due by **Noon on Monday, March 2, 2020**. Applications and essays should be addressed to the attention of Mrs. Jill Pinkerton, President of the Women's Club, and can be returned to either the St. Joseph Rectory or the St. Francis Xavier Parish Office.

On Sunday, January 19, the **Daughters of St. Francis de Sales** attended the 10:30 Mass at St. Joseph's Church and then stayed for a luncheon in the Community Room. The Daughters are an association of consecrated lay women who are devoted to the teachings of Francis de Sales (Salesian spirituality).

Though he died almost four hundred years ago, Francis still seems fresh and relevant with his practical suggestions for how people can try to live a more joyful and devout life. He focuses on being nonjudgmental, gentle, patient with others, and patient with ourselves. He is a Doctor of the Church whose writings influenced most of the Vatican II documents.

If any women of the parish are seeking a deeper prayer life, they may want to consider embarking on the Salesian spiritual journey.
