
Our Mission:

Dear Friends,

Happy Easter! Jesus Christ is risen. Alleluia!

Today we have another appearance of the resurrected Christ to the downtrodden and probably fearful disciples. He walks with them, talks to them and finally breaks bread with them... and they recognize Him in that familiar action. All week, after reading today's gospel passage, I have been running around humming a song we used to sing when I was in college. It is called simply, "In the breaking of the bread." The song contains striking lyrics.

"In the breaking of the bread, we have known him; we have been fed.

Jesus the stranger, Jesus the Lord, be our companion; be our hope."

The songwriter accomplishes two things with the refrain. One, he reminds us that the Risen Christ does not want to be a stranger. Two, he makes a profession of faith and a petition for Divine assistance. He also makes me think about my own devotion to the Eucharist. I suppose during this time of pandemic, when we cannot share reception of the Eucharist in our public usual way, it makes us think of our own relationship with Jesus. He comes to us truly present in the Eucharist - even if these days it is simply over the Internet waves.

Do I recognize Him in the breaking of the bread?

Do I know that Christ is truly present, alive and coming to be with us at the Mass?

In the midst of all life brings me, can I really trust Jesus to be my companion and my hope?

Do I make a spiritual communion with our Eucharistic Lord, even when watching the Mass in my home?

If I answer these questions with a "yes," as I presume we would all like to do, then how does that call me to approach the Eucharist? I think a "yes" will demand a few things from us.

Recognizing Jesus in the breaking of the bread requires an attitude of awe. He is present, really present, in the simple form of bread and wine! The theologians call it transubstantiation. I call it gift. The recipients of the gift can only appreciate the gift when they open the gift with wonder and awe. Think of the love that God has for us. So great was God's love, that He sent His only Son, who not only lived and died for us, but He gave us the Eucharist, His Body and Blood, as a living memorial of that love.

Perhaps before this pandemic, we dragged ourselves to Mass, more out of an obligation, or to avoid guilt, than out of an awestruck response to God's love. In the Eucharist, in the


breaking of the bread, if we allow ourselves to reflect for some moments on what it is we are doing, we will know Him more closely, more intimately, more dearly. I long for the day that on the other side of the broken bread I raise during the fraction rite, I will see your faces in a full church. That day will come. I'm convinced.

Trusting Jesus to be our companion necessitates a commitment on our part. We cannot claim companionship with someone to whom we rarely speak. This relationship calls for some mutuality. The One who is our companion and our hope is always waiting for us, is always there for us and is always calling us. Here in Wilmette, we recognize Him. The scores of people who ventured out last Sunday to adore our Eucharistic Lord as we processed from Saint Francis to Saint Joseph moved me to tears.

Some of my spiritual heroes often spoke of the time before the Blessed Sacrament as being the most important times of their days. Saint Mother Theresa insisted that her followers spend an hour a day before Jesus in the Tabernacle. When the churches open again, commit to spending time with Jesus in adoration.

Let's commit to a life companioning with Jesus. He is our hope!
