
Our Mission:

Dear Friends, Happy Mother's Day!

Do not let your hearts be troubled. Believe.
Do the works that I have done.

This threefold command given to the disciples, who really didn't get it, is given to us today. Everything that is happening in our Church and in our world may tempt us to worry or despair. On this Mother's Day, I thank God for the mothers who keep calm in the midst of difficulties, who believe and share their beliefs, and who do the works of Jesus.

It troubles my heart each week to celebrate Mass in an empty church. But Jesus says do not have troubled hearts. He calls us to have faith in God and faith in Him. When we allow Jesus to calm our troubled hearts, when we believe that God is God and we are not, and when we do the works of Jesus, especially His work with those who are poor and troubled, we put our faith into action.


Putting this into practice takes discipline, especially during these challenging days of quarantine. When we say we trust, or believe, or have faith in God, we need to really allow God to lead us, to guide our lives. We might rather put our trust, faith, and belief, in ourselves, but that will not suffice. We belong to God. He made us. He gives us what we need. Truly, we are nothing without Him.

Today's Gospel is often proclaimed at funeral Masses. The Spanish translation of the first sentence is striking. "No pierdan la paz." Do not lose peace. Jesus, over and over again in the post-resurrection accounts in the Gospels offers peace to His disciples – His peace. As modern-day disciples we must live in the peace of Christ and not lose peace. We must become peacemakers by the way we live our lives. In so many ways, our mothers do this.

As you listen to the words of Jesus today, you might want to ask yourself what causes your peace, or really *His* peace in you, to be shaken. In this time of pandemic, when we are growing weary of being at home, and when we long ever more for reception of our Lord in the Eucharist, human emotions can lay claim to heartfelt peace. There are many causes of inquietude. Family

relationships, employment or financial issues, world events, gossip, and uncertainty about when and how we will get back to the "new normal" can shake our peace.

In order for us to not be troubled, Jesus gives us the solution, "have faith in God and faith in me." When we begin to lose the peace, we need to



Believing is a great way to maintain peace. It is, though, just a start. Jesus tells Thomas, who asks "We do not know where you are going, how can we know the way?" and Phillip who demands to see the Father, and the rest of his disciples, "The one who believes in me will do the works I do." As believers, we must continue the mission of Jesus Christ. We must live His love and share His mercy with the world.

As believers, we must do the work He does. Think about it. Think of all the wonderful ways Jesus did the will of the Father while He walked this earth. Think of the way your mothers do it or did it. Then think about the ways you can continue the work in your own life. That is the life of the Church. That is the life of the Christian. In these uncertain times, our world needs us to follow the way, the truth and the life.

Listen again to the words of Saint Peter, "You are 'a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people of his own, so that you may announce the praises' of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light."

Let's live in the light!

Below is a reprint of the article from the Chicago Catholic issue for May 10, 2020 entitled: "Parish surprises priest with drive-by parade for 89th birthday"

Father Ed Harnett came to St. Francis Xavier Parish in Wilmette in 1984, and has made many good friends in the community, but he never had a birthday celebration like the one he had April 30.

That's when Harnett, who turned 89 years old that day, was saluted with a birthday parade, including vehicles from the Wilmette police and fire departments and about 100 cars.

"It took maybe 15 or 20 minutes for everyone to pass by," said Father Wayne Watts, pastor of the now-combined Sts. Joseph and Francis Xavier Parish.

Watts organized the birthday parade, sending an invitation to parishioners in his daily email April 29 and making sure to leave Harnett and the priests who live with him off the distribution list. Then he arranged with one of the priests to bring Harnett outside at the right moment.

"I was inside talking with one of the other priests, and he said, 'There's a big sign for your birthday in the front yard. You'd better come see it." said Harnett, now pastor emeritus.

When they stepped outside, the hook-andladder truck that was leading the parade started its siren and the parade began.

"It was quite a surprise," Harnett said. "I was absolutely stunned. It was incredible."

Watts said the gesture was intended not only to show Harnett how much parishioners loved him, but also to give parishioners something to smile about.

"He's 89, he's served our church so well," Watts said. "Many people are getting a little tired of the home confinement. He's followed the directions of the home confinement, and I don't think he's left the house since mid-March. He's a great guy and people love him, and I wanted to give people the opportunity to celebrate him."

Harnett said the rest of his birthday passed quietly.

"Very quiet," he said in a telephone interview that evening. "We're like everybody else, keeping our distance and trying to not cause any health problems. It was enough excitement this morning."

Fr. Harnett's Birthday Parade thank you is below.

Friends,

First, I don't know how to say thank you for all you arranged on my 89th birthday. Frankly, I was in total disbelief when the fire engine procession started and still am! I am sitting down now at my computer just after coming in from the "parade." When it started, I was simply in stunned disbelief. I regret that I didn't get to see those who were in the first cars to thank you at the beginning of the "parade" and many cars passed before my mind could get itself around what was happening.

I have been at St. Francis (now Saints Joseph and Francis Xavier) since 1984 and truly love the parish and especially you who make the parish what it is. When Cardinal Bernardin assigned me to St. Francis Xavier, he said he had given it a lot of thought. I don't know all his thoughts and reasons, but for me it has been a blessing. I have found our parish a challenging and generous community. Over the years, I have told classmates that what I especially enjoyed about the people of the parish is the willingness to step forward and take hold of opportunities and challenges with a generous heart and I truly meant it. But also, on a more personal level, you have been true friends over the years, and again today.

And a special thanks to Fr. Watts for all the arrangements for today.


