
Our Mission:

For centuries Christians have been, at least in song and prayer, inviting the Holy Spirit to dwell in their hearts, to rule their lives, to guide them, comfort them, inspire them and give them the gifts the Holy Spirit is capable of giving. Thousands of prayers and hundreds of songs fill traditional books and now fly in cyberspace. Each of us may recall his or her favorite Holy Spirit prayer or song. As you might imagine, knowing me by now as a friend of the Holy Spirit, I have many favorite Holy Spirit things.

As graduating seniors at Marquette University in 1986, we celebrated a beautiful Baccalaureate Mass on the eve of graduation, the vigil of Pentecost. Since it was the eighties and it was a Jesuit school, we sang, for the first time in public, a Saint Louis Jesuit song to the Holy Spirit. There we were on the verge of a big change in our lives, 2,000 young men and women and their families, asking God to send us the Holy Spirit. On that day, aware that I would be entering the seminary in the fall, I meant what I sang. Since then, the Holy Spirit has been my constant companion.

Six weeks after I was ordained a priest, I had the opportunity to spend some time with a wise and holy priest, Father Theodore Hesburgh. My brother married his niece. Fr. Hesburgh told me that he prays to the Holy Spirit after Communion at each Mass he celebrates. He prays that prayer for the people in the pews, the people he loves, the people he serves. It was a nice reminder to me to not only rely on the Holy Spirit for myself, but to encourage the people of God to come to know and love the third person of the Trinity, and to rely on the Holy Spirit throughout their daily lives.

I pray this prayer for you. Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And you shall renew the face of the earth. O God who has instructed the hearts of the faithful by the light of the Holy Spirit, grant that by the same Spirit we may ever be truly wise and ever rejoice in his consolation. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

In the prayer for confirmation, the presider is usually the bishop. But in celebrations of RCIA, as we did at the Easter Vigil seven weeks ago, the priest prays for the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the candidates for Confirmation.

"Send the Holy Spirit to be their helper and their guide ... " It is so nice to pray those words. Think about it. All of us have been given the Holy Spirit at Baptism and at Confirmation. The Holy Spirit can really be our helper and our guide, in little ways and big ways. God wants to shower us with the gifts of the Holy Spirit. It is up to us to use these gifts.



With the gifts of the Holy Spirit, the disciples began to renew the face of the earth. They lost their fear and found courage. They lost their sadness and found joy. The Holy Spirit does the same for us if we permit it to happen.

Without a doubt, we have benefitted from the outpouring of the Holy Spirit in our local community. I still am amazed at all that has happened here over the past few years. God is good! I smile when I think of the RCIA candidates waiting to receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit in Confirmation. As they wait to become fully initiated members of our community, we have begun the task (and I invite you to join me) of inviting others to consider making the RCIA journey and receiving the gifts of the Spirit at the Easter Vigil next spring, God willing, there will be a Vigil. If you know of anyone who might be interested in the RCIA program, please contact me or Kieran Lyons in the parish office.

The Holy Spirit has filled this parish with joy amidst the pandemic. If we live in the joy that the Holy Spirit offers we can attract, simply by sharing our joy, others to come to know the Church that has been given the support and the guidance and the love of the Holy Spirit. With the Spirit's gifts, the Lord empowers us for the work of ministry. We can renew the face of Wilmette. We can renew the face of Chicago. We can renew the face of the earth!

I hope the Holy Spirit will enlighten you and fill you with the wisdom and joy only the Holy Spirit can offer. Rejoice in God's gift! Live the fire of the Spirit's love!
